

#### Capital Project Work

#### @ Genesee Elementary School

Work commencing this summer will consist primarily of main office renovations, new heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) in some classrooms, cafeteria and library, and a new outdoor playground.

The main office work will include new exterior entry with canopy and accessible entry. Parking spaces will be marked along Garrow Street to accommodate the new secure single point of entry.

HVAC equipment will be upgraded in other spaces within the building, and some areas will be outfitted with new ceilings and shelving along the perimeter of rooms where the work is proposed.

A major portion of the work is proposed to be complete in the fall with certain scope areas continuing in duration through part of the school year, which will not disrupt academic/learning activities. The project was competitively bid earlier this year with the results coming in under budget.



#### The Chicken or the Egg?



Mrs. Gremli's, Mrs. Swartz's and Mrs. Engle's Kindergarten classes at Herman Ave. did a science unit on the life cycle of chickens. We were able to get an incubator and chicken eggs from Cornell Cooperative Extension.

We learned that chicken eggs start to hatch between 21-23 days. It is important to keep the incubator temperature at 99-100 degrees. We also had to add water to keep the humidity at 50-60 percent and increase it to 60-70 percent when they start to hatch. It was amazing to see the chicks hatch. We learned that chicks have an egg tooth that helps them break out of the egg. When they first start to hatch you can see a little crack in the egg and then the chick works hard to chip away at the shell and hatch. It can take several hours for them to hatch. A newly hatched chick is called a hatchling. They are not fuzzy and soft when they first hatch. They are very tired and wet. It takes time for them to dry off. They are added to the brooder which is a heated container. We add food and water and they learn how to eat and drink. They get soft and fuzzy quickly in the brooder.

We loved hatching our chicks and learning all about their life cycle and how to care for them once they hatch. We were able to keep them in our classroom until they were strong enough to go back to the farm to be with their family.





Dear Parents/Guardians,

As of July 1, 2018, New York State law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and when entering Pre-K or K,  $1^{st}$ ,  $3^{rd}$ ,  $5^{th}$ ,  $7^{th}$ ,  $9^{th}$ , and  $11^{th}$  grade.

The examination must be completed by a New York State licensed physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner and on the approved NYSED Student Health Examination Form for School.

A dental certificate which states your child has been seen by a dentist or dental hygienist is also asked for at the same time. The school will provide you with a list of dentists and registered dental hygienists who offer dental services on a free or reduced cost basis if you ask for it.

- A copy of the health examination must be provided to the school within 30 days from when your child first starts at the school, and when your child starts K , 1st , 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, & 11th grades. If a copy is not given to the school within 30 days, the school will contact you.
- If your child has an appointment for an exam during this school year that is after the first 30 days of school, please notify the Health Office with the date.
- Communication between private and school health staff is important for safe and effective care at school. Your healthcare provider may not share health information with school health staff without your signed permission. Please talk to your provider about signing their consent form for the school at the time of your child's appointment for the examination.

We suggest you make copies of the completed forms for your own records before sending them to the school health office.

Summer is a great time to be sure that your students' immunizations are up to date! Below is an overview of the *required* vaccinations for NY students entering Pre- K – Grade 12

## Block Out UV Rays

- Cover up. Wear tightly-woven clothing that blocks out light. Try this test: Place your hand between a single layer of the clothing and a light source. If you can see your hand through the fabric, the garment offers little protection.
- Use sunscreen. A sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15 blocks 93 percent of UV rays. You want to block both UVA and UVB rays to guard against skin cancer. Be sure to follow application directions on the bottle.
- Wear a hat. A wide brim hat (not a baseball cap) is ideal because it protects the neck, ears, eyes, forehead, nose, and scalp.
- Wear UV-absorbent shades. Sunglasses don't have to be expensive, but they should block 99 to 100 percent of UVA and UVB radiation.
- Limit exposure. UV rays are most intense bet ween 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. If you're unsure about the sun's intensity, take the shadow test: If your shadow is shorter than you, the sun's rays are the day's strongest.

## Pediculosis (lice, head lice, body lice, pubic lice, cooties, crabs)

#### What is pediculosis?

Pediculosis is an infestation of the hairy parts of the body or clothing with the eggs, larvae or adults of lice. The crawling stages of this insect feed on human blood, which can result in severe itching. Head lice are usually located on the scalp, crab lice in the pubic area and body lice along seams of clothing. Body lice travel to the skin to feed and return back to the clothing.

#### Who gets pediculosis?

Anyone may become louse infested under suitable conditions of exposure. Pediculosis is easily transmitted from person to person during direct contact. Head lice infestations are frequently found in school settings or institutions. Crab lice infestations can be found among sexually active individuals. Body lice infestation can be found in people living in crowded, unsanitary conditions where clothing is infrequently changed or laundered.

#### How is pediculosis spread?

For both head lice and body lice, transmission can occur during direct contact with an infested individual. Sharing of clothing and combs or brushes may also result in transmission of these insects. While other means are possible, crab lice are most often transmitted through sexual contact.

#### What are the symptoms of pediculosis?

Usually, the first indication of an infestation is the itching or scratching in the area of the body where the lice feed. Scratching at the back of the head or around the ears should lead to an examination for head louse eggs (nits) on the hair. Itching around the genital area should lead to an examination for crab lice or their eggs. Scratching can be sufficiently intense to result in secondary bacterial infection in these areas.

#### How soon do symptoms appear?

It may take as long as two to three weeks or longer for a person to notice the intense itching associated with this infestation.

For how long is a person able to spread pediculosis? Pediculosis can be spread as long as lice or eggs remain alive on the

#### infested person or clothing. What is the treatment for pediculosis?

Medicated shampoos or cream rinses containing pyrethrins or permethrin are preferred for treating people with head lice. Products containing pyrethrins, permethrin or malathion are available over-the-counter, but those containing lindane or malathion are available only through a physician's prescription. Lindane-based shampoos are not recommended for infants, young children, pregnant women, lactating women, the elderly, persons with HIV or seizure disorders, persons who have very irritated skin or sores where the lidane will be applied and persons who weigh less than 110 pounds. Retreatment after 7 to 10 days is often recommended to ensure that no eggs have survived. Nit combs are available to help remove nits from hair. Dose and duration of shampoo treatment should be followed carefully according to label instructions.

#### What can be done to prevent the spread of pediculosis?

Physical contact with infested individuals and their belongings, especially clothing, headgear and bedding, should be avoided. Health education on the life history of lice, proper treatment and the importance of laundering clothing and bedding in hot water or dry cleaning to destroy lice and eggs is extremely valuable. In addition, regular direct inspection of children for head lice, and when indicated, of body and clothing, particularly of children in schools, institutions, nursing homes and summer camps, is important.


#### A Traveling Teacher Virtual Field Trip

At the end of our virtual field trip series students who participated in each virtual field trip will receive a goodie bag with items from places that we visit.




#### HOW TO BE COOL IN THIRD GRADE


