Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)

Students who are applying to colleges, please be aware that procedures for the confidentiality of student records within the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) have recently changed. FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.



MARCH is Music in our Schools Month



Led by the National Association for Music Education (NAfME), music educators and students throughout the United States and overseas are demonstrating the powerful role that a quality music program plays in the lives of young people. On March 14th, 1973, the New York State School Music Association (NYSSMA) initiated and celebrated the first ever Music In Our Schools Day. This has since evolved into a month long national and international celebration.

At present, students and educators, K-12, in the Auburn Enlarged City School District are engaged in a variety of music related activities. These activities explore many different concepts, including how music is connected to other core subjects and how music can help us strengthen our successful character traits.

Students at all levels are also exploring specific music concepts such as music reading, moving to the beat while creating patterns/rhythms, playing piano, sight-reading, instrument specific techniques, and playing together as an ensemble.

Some of our Seward Elementary and Auburn High School students are involved in an age-appropriate version of March Madness. Our elementary students are using songs from our online curriculum, Quaver, to compete. At the high school level, concert marches that have been selected by the "President's Own" Marine Corps Band are being utilized for the competition.

Elementary instrumental students at Genesee and Owasco are participating in a building-wide game where they are learning about the musical experiences enjoyed by the building's staff members. At Casey Park, students have the opportunity to "perform" and/or write music in a virtual environment. Several students representing intermediate through high school are preparing to participate in NYSSMA sponsored solo festivals. Students prepare a solo and scales to perform for a judge. The solos may represent difficulty levels from I - VI. All performances are being conducted virtually for this upcoming Spring Solo season. Approximately 12 AHS students representing band, chorus & orchestra are preparing All-State Level VI solos! These are the most rigorous of all of the various solo levels. Currently students representing the AJHS Chorus, AJHS Orchestra, AHS Band and AHS Orchestra are preparing individual performances to be included in collective virtual All-County ensembles. AJHS Band and AHS Chorus students participated in a similar experience last Fall.



All levels of band, chorus and orchestra, represented throughout the district, are considering a variety of options for both virtual and/or live "Spring Concerts" to be able to share with family and friends the collaborative work that they have done in preparing music for performance throughout the year.

At present, planning is underway for the Spring version of our AHS Musical Theatre presentation. Stay tuned for updates...

The AHS Vanguard Marching Band & Color Guard, which includes students from AJHS and AHS, participated in the USBands virtual State Championships last Fall, finishing in First Place for the "Creative" division. These same students, along with the AHS Jazz Band, are currently preparing performances to be entered in the Sherburne virtual Pageant of Bands this Spring.

Congratulations to Mrs. Mucedola (Elementary band) and Mr. Miller (AHS band) on their upcoming retirements. Congratulations also to Dr. <u>Douglas McCall</u>, former Director of Choirs at AHS, on the successful completion of his PHD in Music Education through Penn State University. Dr. McCall will be returning to the district in the Fall of 2021.

On behalf of all AECSD music students and staff, we want to thank the BOE, administration and especially the community for their continued unwavering support of our full K-12 Music Programs (general music, vocal, orchestra, band, musical theater, marching band, jazz band, as well as a variety of individual performance opportunities, et.al.)!

Important STAR Tax INFORMATION

Again, this year, Governor Cuomo has included in his budget proposal various School Tax Relief (STAR) Program Actions. He is requiring those who have not yet switched over from the STAR exemption (reduction directly taken off the school tax bill) to the STAR Tax Relief check (credit), to

do so by May 1, 2021 in order to receive the check in time for your school tax bill. If the change to the credit is not made by the deadline, the exemption will still be received for the current year but any difference generated by the credit will be issued as a check. The current deadline is June 15, 2021.

Why should you switch to the STAR credit? In 2019, New York State announced that the value of the STAR exemption will no longer increase, yet, the STAR Tax Relief check may increase by as much as 2% each year and never be less than the amount received from the exemption. If you currently receive your STAR benefit as a reduction on your school tax bill (the STAR exemption), you may receive a greater benefit if you switch to the STAR credit to receive a check instead. Therefore, by making the switch you could receive a greater benefit.

To see what the savings could be for your home, take a look at your 2019-2020 school tax bill to see what your STAR savings was and then multiply that by 1.02. For example, if your savings was \$800 in 2019-2020 then next year your STAR credit could be \$816, an additional savings of \$16. Yet if you continue with receiving the exemption it will remain the same, year after year.

Open Enrollment for Auburn Enlarged City School District's 2021-2022 Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program

The Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program is an integral component of our district and includes a UPK program for our 4 year-old learners and a 3PK program for 3 year-olds. Together, these programs offer comprehensive educational services to <u>Auburn School District residents</u> who will be 3 or 4-years of age on or before December 1st, 2021 and are available at *no cost* for eligible children.

The school district is pleased to partner with Anonymous Alerts®, the anti-bullying and safety reporting app and system. This safety communications tool is a way for our students to quickly communicate anonymously with school officials and engage in anonymous 2-way communications to share more information about incidents. Types of concerns that may be reported include, but are not limited to, bullying, harassment, drug-related issues, fighting, weapons, threats, and more. The goal of this reporting system is to help maintain a safe school climate while giving students ample opportunity to securely communicate with school administrators without fear of retribution by their peers. The system will be monitored during school days between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.
