Welcome Back Letter from Jeff Pirozzolo, Superintendent

I hope you had a wonderful summer vacation and are ready to start the 2019-20 school year. We anticipate your return and are excited to welcome you back! We have a lot of new faces this year -- including administrators, teachers and support staff -- and are looking forward to introducing the newest members of our Auburn family on opening day.

As always, we have been busy over the summer planning and preparing for the year ahead. For the second year, we are utilizing elementary **Innovation Labs** to integrate STREAM (science, technology, research, engineering, art and music) instruction into our core curriculum. In these labs, technology instruction enhances the art and music curriculum through interdisciplinary design projects and experiments that connect to students' work in the classroom. Additionally, we will begin implementation of New York State's Next Generation Learning Standards in English Language Arts and math while continuing to implement the new social studies and science standards.

Beginning last school year and into this summer, most of our faculty and staff received training under the Therapeutic Crisis Intervention for Schools (TCIS) and Trauma Informed Care (TIC) models. Our staff are now equipped with the tools to better support the **social-emotional health** of all our students, especially those in crisis. We look forward to continuing this work throughout the year.

We continue to expand **student access to technology** and have added over 2,200 devices districtwide, including 58 Chromebook carts. We're excited to announce we have reached a 1:1 device ratio for our students! We also converted both Seward and Herman Avenue Elementary staff to Windows-based laptops. Finally, we are in the process of rolling out replacements for our existing conference request and field trip systems. We will have more information on both very soon.

Our administrative team is working on initial submissions to the state education department so that construction for our \$43.7 million **capital project**, which voters overwhelmingly approved in January, can begin. Phase 1A work is expected to begin in the summer of 2020. This first phase includes a new roof at Owasco Elementary, a new playground at Herman Avenue Elementary, and site work at various buildings. Major

construction in all seven buildings, totaling approximately \$22 million, is set to begin in the summer of 2021.

Safety continues to be a priority in our district. We are moving forward with implementation of the Raptor visitor management system at our school buildings, allowing staff to screen visitors. The system is currently in place at the high school and junior high buildings, and we will pilot it at Casey Park Elementary this year. Please remember to bring a government-issued identification card with you if you plan to visit these buildings.

We also plan to revisit our district's mission statement and goals in the coming year and will be seeking input from those interested on serving on district-wide planning teams.

Our **advocacy committee** continues to gain community support for equitable school funding by New York State. Signed petitions will be making their way to multiple area legislators and the governor's office early this school year. Please continue to check www.fixandfundit.org for updates on this important effort.

We will continue our Every Student Present **attendance initiative**, stressing the importance of regular attendance at school. When children miss school, their ability to learn and succeed declines.

On behalf of the Board of Education and administration, thank you for your continued support of the Auburn Enlarged City School District. We look forward to seeing all of our students on the first day of school – Tuesday, September 3!

NAMI Basics Parent Education Course to be held in Auburn

The Auburn Enlarged City School District will host the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Basics Parent Education Program this fall.

The six-week class will be held from 5:30 to 8 p.m. each Wednesday from Oct. 2 to Nov. 6 in the board room of the Harriet Tubman Administration Building, 78 Thornton Ave. The class is voluntary and FREE for up to 20 participants on a first-come, first-serve basis.

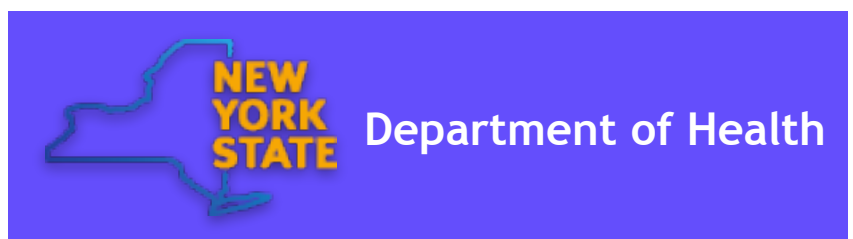
NAMI Basics is designed to help support parents and caregivers of children and adolescents experiencing mental health challenges. Trained peers will guide participants on how to better understand and support children while maintaining one's own well-being. The class provides caregivers with skills, knowledge and a community of people who can relate to the experience of raising a child with mental health symptoms.

Instructors will provide participants with practical, up-to-date information about mental health challenges. Attendees will learn how to effectively advocate for children within school and mental health systems and will develop problem-solving and communication skills.

Snacks and beverages will be provided, and participants will receive a binder full of resources.

Update on School Vaccination Requirements in NYS



Governor Andrew M. Cuomo signed legislation removing non-medical exemptions from school vaccination requirements for children.

As of June 13, 2019, there is no longer a religious exemption to the requirement that children be vaccinated against measles and other diseases to attend either public, private or parochial school (for students in pre-kindergarten through 12th grade), or child day care settings.

ATTENDANCE: A Key to Student Success!

Research shows that children who are in school most of the time do better on state tests. Studies also show that kids who are absent more often score lower on state tests. Being late for school hurts a child's learning too. A student who is 10 minutes late every day will miss 30 hours of instruction during the year. Children can copy notes or make up an assignment, but they can never get back what's most important: the discussions, the questions, all of the explanations by the teacher and the thinking that makes learning come alive. Four Reasons Auburn Celebrates Birthdays Without Food

We Promote Healthy Minds and Healthy Bodies



1 We are working to promote healthy minds and healthy bodies at Auburn. The research is clear - healthy kids learn better. To provide the best possible learning environment for children, schools must provide an environment that supports healthy behaviors. According to the Auburn Enlarged City School District Wellness Policy, students are to receive nutrition education that teaches the skills and attitudes they need to adopt healthy eating behaviors. The policy also states that the school district encourages parents, teachers, school administrators, support staff, and community members to serve as role models in practicing healthy eating and being physically active, both in school and at home. Decreasing the availability of "empty calorie" foods, foods that are high in fat, sugar and salt with little nutritional value (the type typically brought in for birthday celebrations), is just one strategy schools can use to promote wellness.

2 Instructional Time will be Preserved

Less instructional time will be lost with this policy. In the past, anywhere between 15 - 30 minutes of class time was used for each birthday party. At the conclusion of the party, very often the birthday child would then walk around the building offering the extra treats to teachers, usually accompanied by a friend or two. This resulted in several disruptions to other classes, and more instructional time lost for the birthday child and his/her friends. Auburn will still celebrate birthdays, however it will be done in a way that preserves as much instructional time as possible.

3 Every Child's Birthday will be Special

Every child's birthday will be celebrated. There are a few children in each of our classrooms that do not celebrate their birthday in school with treats brought in from home. This happens for a variety of reasons, some of which are unknown to us. We do know that some parents cannot afford to send in treats, some do not have transportation, and some cannot take time off from work. With this policy, no student will be excluded.

4 All Students will be Safe

Safety is a priority at Auburn. With this policy, students with food allergies, diabetes, or other food-related health issues will be safer, and will stop feeling excluded as they have on several occasions in the past. Even though teachers and parents took care to provide a safe snack for these children, these children do not enjoy being singled out 15 - 20 times per year. In addition, it could not be guaranteed that treats were sanitary. We have witnessed cupcakes being dropped on the way into school and being placed back on the tray, fingerprints and hair on cupcakes, students sneezing on an open container of cookies, etc. When it comes to students with food allergies, it is not just a matter of breaking out with hives, sneezing, and having a runny nose. Lives may be endangered. Even in classrooms where there was a strict policy in place regarding the types of food that could be brought into the classroom, not everyone followed the policy. Research has shown that 1/3 of students who have an allergic reaction at school did not previously know they had a life-threatening allergy.

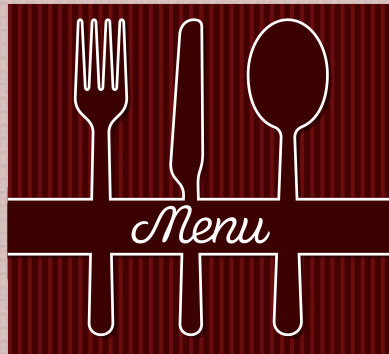

Free and Reduced Meal Applications for 2019-2020

Income Eligibility guidelines and new Free & Reduced Meal Application forms for students at the junior high and high school are available in all school buildings, at the District Office, and online at www.aecsd.education.

New forms are also included in student's beginning of the year information packet distributed by the junior high and high school.

Only one form per family is required. The completed form may be returned to the school office. Timeliness is critical to this process. Please return your application forms as soon as possible to ensure the availability of free or reduced meal prices for your child(ren). BREAKFAST LUNCH

FREE For Elementary Students!

The district will continue to provide breakfast and lunch at no cost to all elementary students. This program, called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), allows all elementary students to obtain complete meals, free of charge, regardless of household income. This program was established by the Food and Nutrition Service of the United States Department of Agriculture to make it easier for children in low-income communities to receive meals at no charge. At the present time, this program is available to students in the elementary schools only. Students entering 7th grade will continue their free eligibility for the first 30 days of the school year. Please turn your applications in as soon as possible. After 30 days, only those students who meet eligibility requirements will continue to receive free meals.

There are no applications to complete for the CEP. As long as the student takes a complete ('reimbursable') meal, it will be free. If the student wishes to purchase a second meal, or only parts of a meal (i.e., milk), there will be a charge for that, so you may wish to keep or establish a prepaid meal account for your child.

The district contracts with Whitsons Culinary Group to provide meals for our students. The Food Service Director is Mike Herr. He can be reached at 315-255-8335.

Anonymous Alerts!

The school district is pleased to continue our partnership with Anonymous Alerts®, the anti-bullying and safety reporting app and system. Starting in the 2018-2019 school year, this safety communications tool is a way for our students to quickly communicate anonymously with school officials and engage in anonymous 2-way communications to share more information about incidents. Types of concerns that may be reported include, but are not limited to, bullying, harassment, drug-related issues, fighting, weapons, threats, and more. The goal of this reporting system is to help maintain a safe school climate while giving students ample opportunity to securely communicate with school administrators without fear of retribution by their peers. The system will be monitored during school days between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)

Students who are applying to colleges, please be aware that procedures for the confidentiality of student records within the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) have recently changed. FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.

THE DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICY

The **Auburn Enlarged City School District** is committed to providing students with a school environment that promotes student health and wellness and reduces childhood obesity. The District Wellness Policy can be viewed on the district website. As part of the policy, the district shall:

- **ensure** that all foods and beverages available in school promote good nutrition, balance and reasonable portion sizes;
- **promote** the sale of non-food items or activities for school fundraisers;
- **require** non-food classroom celebrations; (see article on p. 4)
- **promote** the integration of physical activity in the classroom and encourage staff, families and community to participate in and model physical activity as a valuable part of daily life;
- **integrate** nutrition education that teaches the knowledge, skills and values needed to adopt healthy eating behaviors into the curriculum;
- **promote** fruits, vegetables, whole grain products, low fat dairy products, safe and healthy food preparation methods and health-enhancing nutrition practices;
- **inform** and update the public about the content, implementation and effectiveness of this policy.

• BACK-TO-SCHOOL CHECKLIST •

For Parents Who Have Students with a Health Concern:

- ➔ Make your child's health concern known to the school and school nurse.
- ➔ Introduce yourself and your child to the school nurse.
- ➔ Bring current signed healthcare provider orders.
- ➔ Together with the school nurse and other appropriate school officials, and family, develop an individualized healthcare plan (or other educational plans, as needed, e.g., 504, IEP).
- ➔ Give permission for the school nurse to communicate with your family's healthcare provider.
- ➔ Provide parent/guardian contact information and update the school with any changes.
- ➔ Ask if non-nurses will be providing care (for example, verify who will administer medication) and how these authorized individuals will be supervised.
- ➔ Confirm the school's disaster/emergency plan. Make sure your child's medication and/or medical devices (epinephrine auto-injectors, asthma inhalers, insulin, etc.) will be readily available in an emergency.

For All Parents and Students:

- ➔ Make sure immunizations are up-to-date.
- ➔ Review hygiene tips to prevent the spread of infections.
- ➔ Establish a bedtime and wake-up time to ensure adequate and consistent sleep.
- ➔ Develop a routine for homework and after school activities.
- ➔ Eat breakfast each day at home or at school.
- ➔ Help make appropriate clothing choices (for example, wear comfortable and safe shoes).
- ➔ Keep an open line of communication with your child to ensure that he/she remains safe at school. If a concern arises (such as bullying), contact the appropriate school officials immediately.
- ➔ Get involved! Sign up for the parent organization (PTA/PTO), District Wellness Committee, District Parent Council, and mark events such as back-to-school night and parent/teacher meetings on your calendar.
- ➔ Ask about the school or district's wellness policy (for example, how does the school address nutrition, activity, stress and mental health concerns).

STUDENT HEALTH EXAMINATIONS UPDATE

All students in Kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11, as well as students wishing to participate in sports or become eligible for a working permit, and all new students to the district are mandated by New York State Education Law to have a current examination on record in the health office. The Health Staff encourages you to use your private health care provider for all required school health appraisals for better continuity of care. Should you choose to have a health appraisal done by the school physician or nurse practitioner in school, it will be scheduled at the convenience of the district.

Your child will be asked to disrobe to underclothing. While every effort is made to preserve dignity and privacy, most health offices are too small to provide the level of privacy your child may be used to in his or her private provider's office.

The physician conducts a mini-interview for history. These are age appropriate questions identified by the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Pediatrics. Next, the physical screening examination is done. The exam includes a head-to-toe screening of all major organ systems. Please do not ask the school to conduct this exam unless you seek your own child's permission and understanding of the nature of the exam. Because school examinations, by law, are only screening exams and school providers may not diagnose or prescribe in a school setting, you will be advised of any areas of concern found on examination that require further evaluation by your own provider.

One last suggestion regarding private examinations. Most physicians recommend that you time annual exams around your child's birthday. It may take six to twelve weeks to schedule an appointment, especially over the summer. Please plan accordingly if you have these exams done privately. We understand that during this transition we will all need to be flexible, especially regarding sports participation. Our goal is to facilitate your child's ability to play in a chosen sport. All we ask is that if you have already had an exam done, that you please take a moment to call your private physician to get proof of the exam into the school nurse as soon as possible.

STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES

The district's School Health Services program supports your student's academic success by promoting health in the school setting. One way that we provide care for your student is by performing the health screenings as mandated by the State of New York. During this school year, the following screenings will be required or completed at school:

Vision

- Distance acuity for all newly entering students and students in Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11.
- Near vision acuity and color perception screening for all newly entering students.

Hearing

- Hearing screening for all newly entering students and students in Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11.

Scoliosis

- Scoliosis (spinal curvature) screening for all students 8 to 16 years of age

Health Appraisals

- A physical examination including Body Mass Index and Weight Status Category Information is required for all newly entering students and students in Pre-Kindergarten or Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11.

Dental Certificates

- A dental certificate is requested for all newly entering students and students in Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11.

A letter will be sent home if there are any findings on the screening done at school that would cause concern or need medical follow-up. Please call the school's Health Office if you have any questions or concerns.

PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, Effective July 1, 2001 requires all public and non-public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Auburn Enlarged City School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide application. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile read-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40 CFR 152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

FEDERAL ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT (AHERA) NOTIFICATION

The Auburn Enlarged City School District, in accordance with Section 763.93 of the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), submitted Asbestos Management Plans to the New York State Education Department in 1989. Updated and reviewed annually, these plans contain reports of the accredited asbestos inspector and the reports of the accredited laboratory which analyzed the inspection samples that were taken.














The Management Plans also describe:

- Places in each school building where asbestos was identified

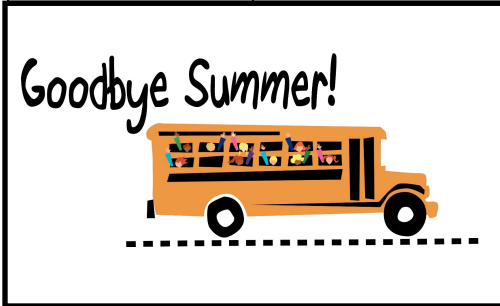

Enhanced STAR Exemption for Senior Citizens

Senior property owners who already have a Basic STAR Exemption on their primary residence may be eligible for the Enhanced STAR Exemption when they are 65. You should apply when you are 64 so that, if you qualify, you may receive the exemption beginning the year that you turn 65. Auburn city residents should contact the Assessor's Office at City Hall on South Street (255-4125). Other Auburn (Aurelius, Throop, Owasco, Sennett, Fleming) and Cayuga County residents should contact their local assessor's office. The deadline for applications for Auburn city residents is February 1. Other Auburn and Cayuga County residents should check with their local assessor.

The Enhanced STAR program for senior citizens provides eligible seniors an exemption from school property taxes for owner-occupied, primary residences. To be eligible for this exemption, a property owner must be 65 years of age or older on December 31, 2019, with income not exceeding \$88,050.

STAR provides qualifying households with up to a \$68,700 exemption on the full value of their property. Qualifying residents owning a home with a full value of \$100,000 will recognize an estimated \$1,181 in Enhanced STAR tax savings in 2019-2020.
