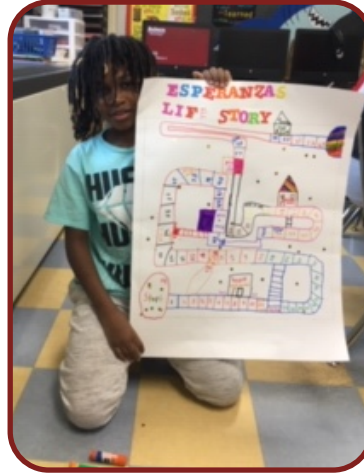
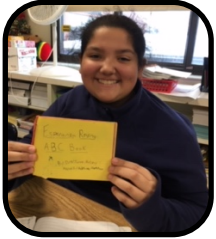

Anonymous Alerts

We now have a great tool called **Anonymous Alerts**, which is an online system that allows students and parents to quickly, easily, and anonymously report strange behavior and information to school officials.

Possible incidents to report could include:

- Bullying / Cyberbullying
- Fighting
- Family difficulties
- Weapons
- Self-harm / Depression
- Threats

The best way to address problems faced in school is by telling a teacher, principal, psychologist, or counselor. However, we do understand that sometimes a student or parent may want to communicate something anonymously. **The most important thing to remember is: See something, Do something!**

All reports submitted through Anonymous Alerts remain completely anonymous, but students and parents do have the option to reveal their identity. The program is monitored from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. on school days, but it is very important to understand that school officials will not be on the system every minute. Anonymous Alerts should only be used for serious matters, but **if something seems disturbing or life threatening, call 911 immediately.**
