


Kindergarten— The Kindergarten students are enjoying learning all about fall. Leaves are changing colors, weather is turning cooler and Halloween is right around the corner.

their individuality.




T—"Does anyone know what King Tuts coffin was made from? S—"Pure brick!"








6th Grade—






