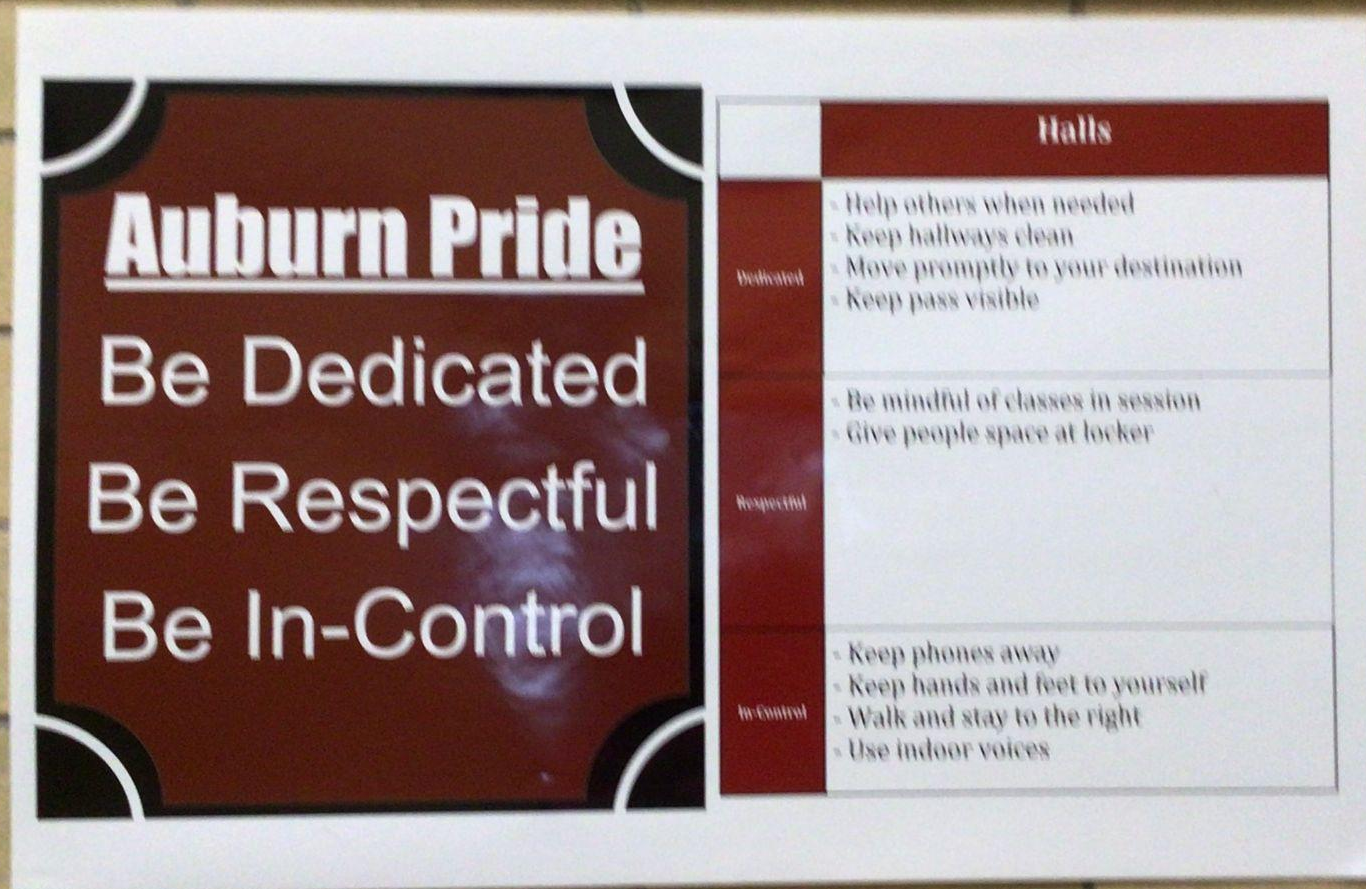
With the help of your grant, Auburn junior high school was able to successfully run a PBIS program this year. The building as a whole serves roughly 650 students and has approximately 100 staff. Everyone in the building participated the PBIS program this year.

Students were able to earn Maroon Bucks in class for demonstrating positive behavior from helping other students, being good school citizens, following directions and respecting classmates and the building.

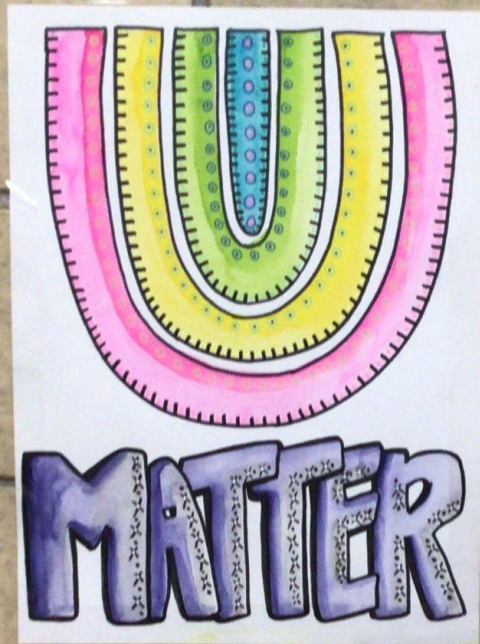
At the junior High, we refer to our positive Character education as “Auburn Pride”.

The three main tenants that we follow are, be dedicated, be respectful and be incontrol. Students demonstrating positive examples of any of these tenants receive maroon bucks from teachers and staff.





Posters were hung all over the building reminding students of our character traits.



With maroon bucks, students were able to purchase items from the school store. With the use of the grant money, We were able to fully stock the school store with items such as airpods, gift certificates, skateboards, small trinkets, art supplies, fidget toys, and much more.

A Google slideshow was created photos of all the items were placed in the slideshow which became the school store. I placed the school store in the Pride Monday Google Classroom where kids had access to it all year long.

Students could fill out an order form located outside of every homeroom door and place an order from the store. These orders were filled during the week and delivered by Friday mornings to homerooms.

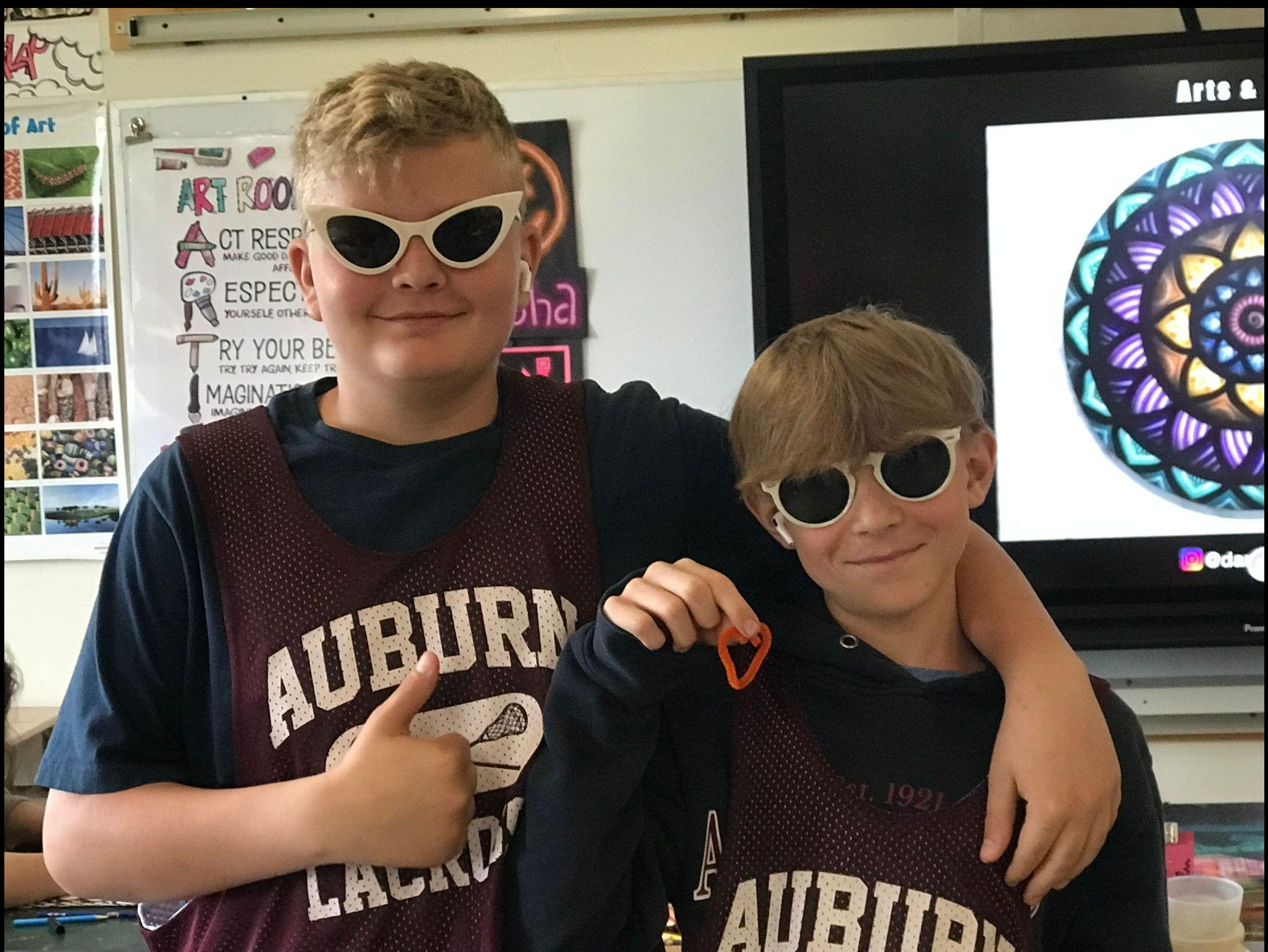


- Acknowledge friends with a wave or head nod.

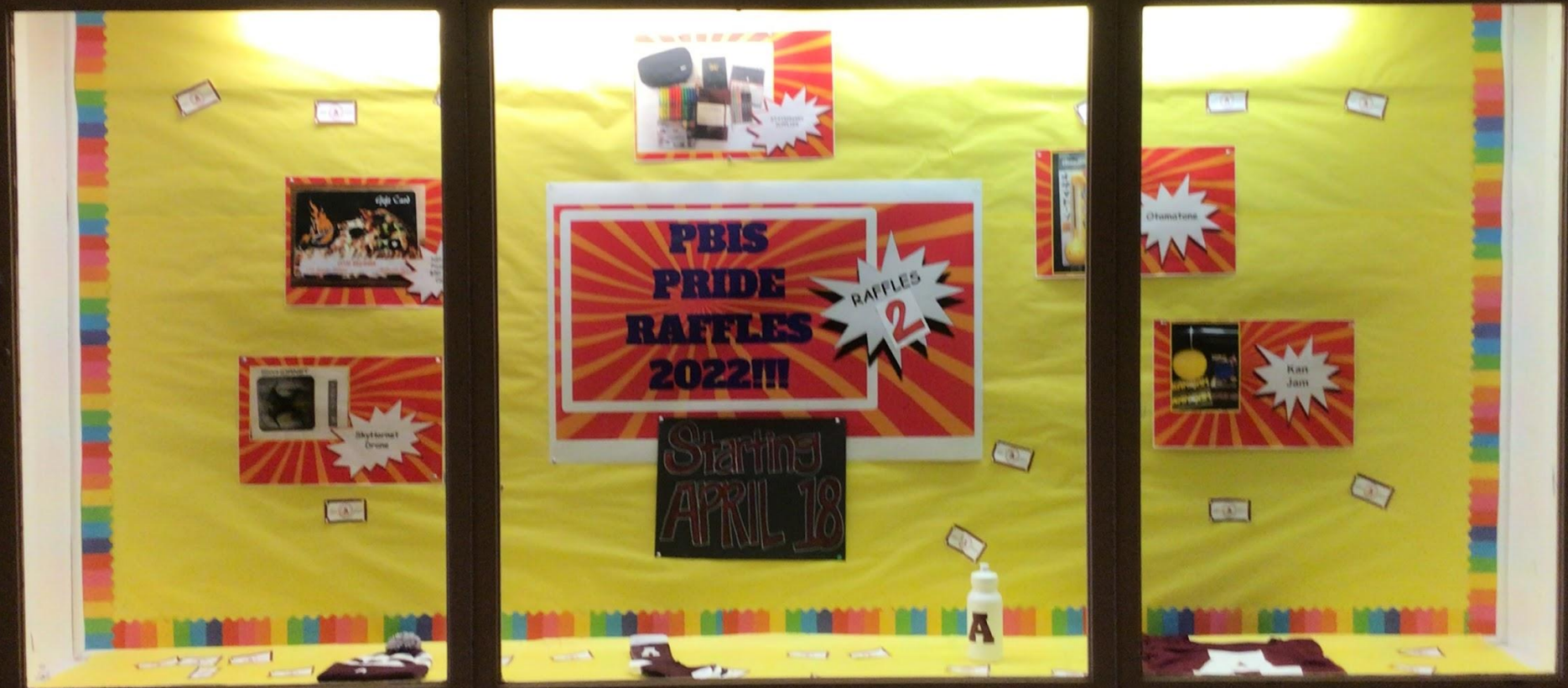
Raffles

Students could also use Maroon Bucks as raffle tickets for a chance to win big ticket items

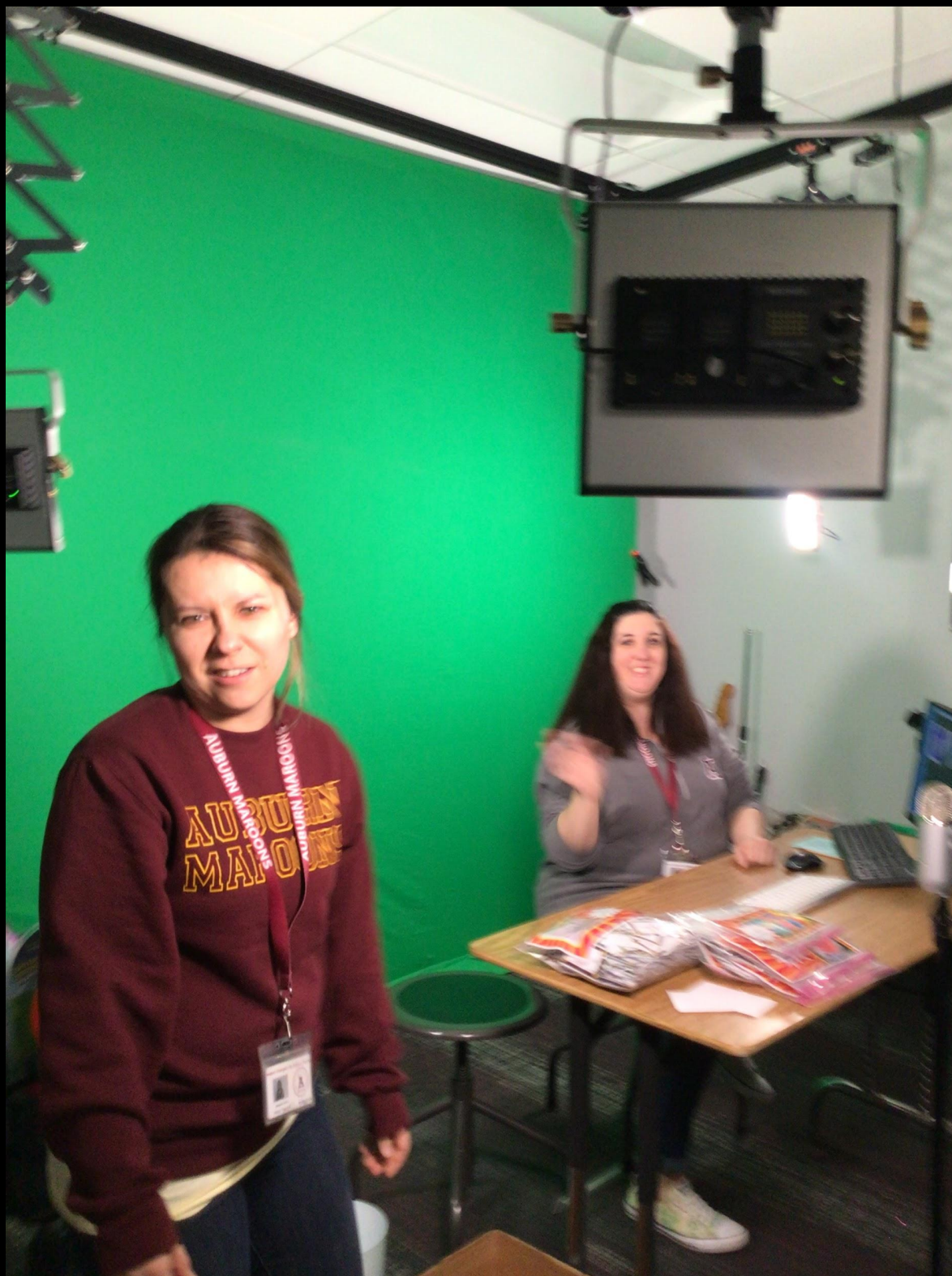


Students during

Party Time!

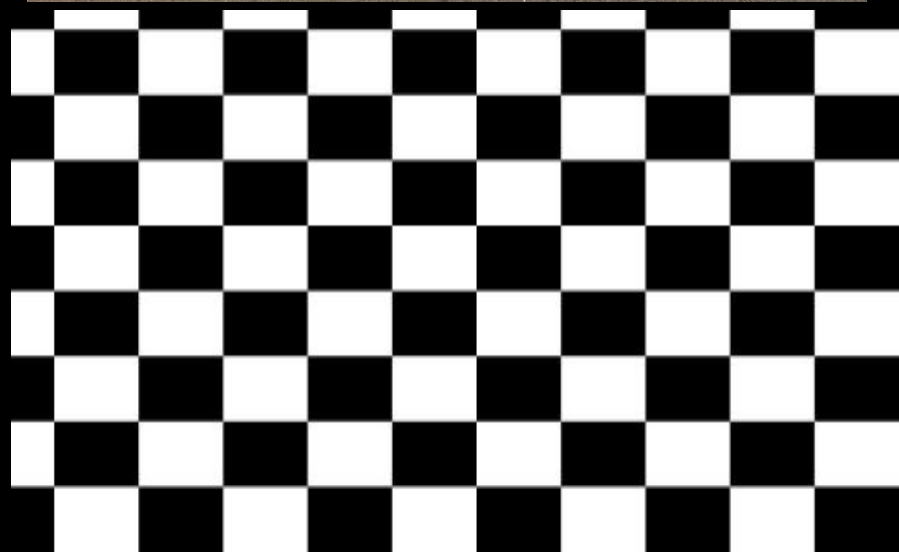
End of the year, PBIS partnered with SGO to put on a fun activity day event for the students.

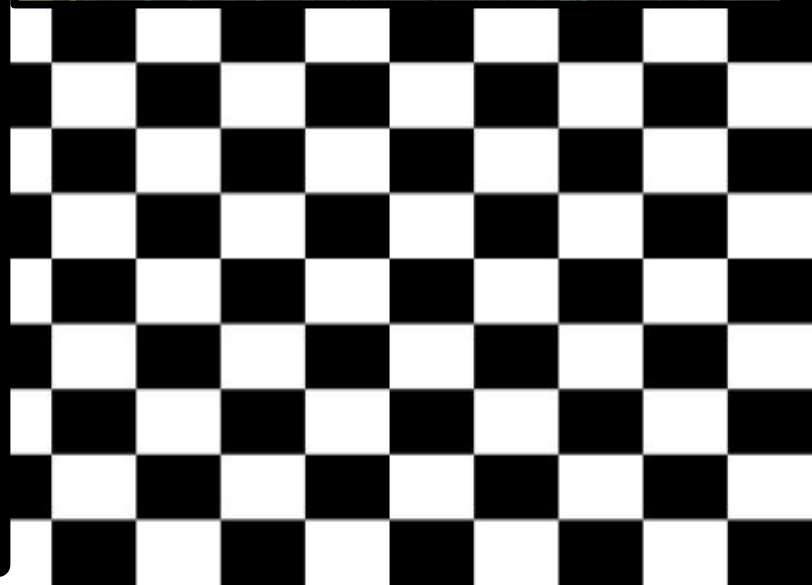
The event included a dj, a dunk tank, sport activities, music activities, and silk walk chalk contests. Prizes for several of the activities were awarded through the PBIS store.

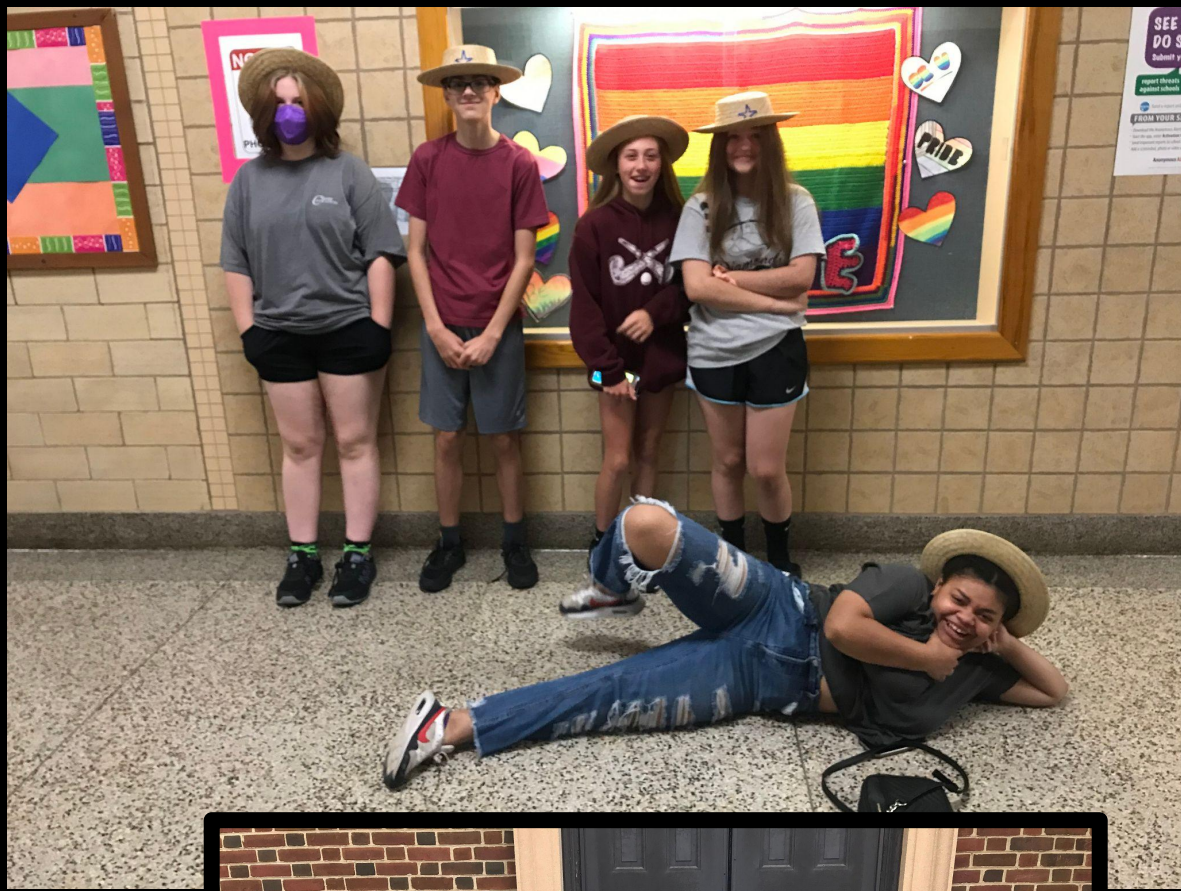



