Dear Parent(s) or Guardian(s):

Three AECSD schools – Casey Park Elementary, Genesee Elementary, and Auburn Junior High School – are currently participating in a School Climate Transformation Grant funded by the U.S. Department of Education. This

program is designed to promote positive learning environments in these schools. The local evaluation of this program is being conducted by the Youth Policy Institute, Inc. As part of this evaluation, AECSD students in Grades 4-8 in the participating schools are asked to complete an anonymous and voluntary online survey each year of the project.

This year, school staff will be administering the surveys May 14th-25th. There are three important features of these evaluation surveys:

- 1. The surveys are anonymous. Students will not have to provide their names or any personal information when taking the survey. School staff will not see any student responses and all student answers will be reported in aggregate form (such as averages or percentages).
- 2. The surveys are voluntary. You may decline to have your child take the survey. Your child may decline to take the survey at any time or may skip any questions in the survey they do not wish to answer. If you or your child declines to participate, your child will be allowed to read or participate in some other activity during the survey. There will be no negative consequences if your child does not participate.
- 3. The surveys are age-appropriate. The survey questions are written to be easily understood for students in Grade 4 and up. School staff will be available to read questions out loud for participants who have any trouble reading.

The success of this evaluation depends on responses from as many students as possible. I hope you will agree to allow your child to participate in this survey. If you agree to allow your child to participate, no action is necessary. AUBURN ATHLETICS . . . Winter 2017-18 Team Summary

Girls Basketball: The team finished the season with an overall record of 11-7 and a league record of 6-2. The team qualified for Sectionals but fell to Liverpool in the first round.

Boys Basketball: The team finished the season with an overall record of 15-7 and a league record of 11-3. The team won the Salt City Athletic Conference league title and qualified for the Section III Tournament. They won their first home game against Proctor, but lost the next at Central Square. Both Scotty Minnoe and Kaleb Cook reached their 1,000 career points on the same night; it marks the first time in Section III history that a team has had two players reach 1,000 points in the same game. Kaleb Cook is All-CNY player of the year. Cook also led Section III in scoring, and Majesty Wilder was the Section III assist leader.

lce Hockey: Auburn finished the season with an overall record of 16-7-2 and a league record of 9-3-1. The team finished in 2nd place in regular season league play and went through the Section

III tournament undefeated to become the Section III Champions. Auburn advanced through the regional tournament defeating Ogdensburg, and earning their way to the "Frozen Four" in Buffalo where they were defeated in the NYS semi-finals. All league first team honors went to Jake Morin and Johnny Malandruccolo; second team honors went to Jack Kalabanka and Ross Burgmaster; and honorable mention team honors went to Brendan Williams, Aidan Hastings and Austin Black. Morin and Malandruccolo were also named to the All-CNY team and the NYS first team all-star team. Congratulations to Jake Morin for being the first player in Auburn Ice Hockey history to reach 100 goals. Jake Morin was named League Player of the Year and Mike Lowe was named All-CNY Coach of the year. Auburn was ranked #1 in NYS during the season and ended with a final ranking of #3. The team also qualified to earn the NYSPHSAA Scholar Athlete Award.



Boys Swimming: The Auburn Boys Varsity Swim team finished their regular season with an overall record of 1-12.

The team finished 10th overall in Sectionals. Sam Carbonaro placed 7th overall in the 200 free with a time of 1:50.74 and placed 4th overall in the 500 free with a time of 5:02.14.

Indoor Track: The boys finished 3rd at leagues and the girls were 6th. Christian Dotts set a new school record in the 55 M HH and the high jump. Christian was also the league champion in the HJ. Josh Cuddy defended his 600 meter league title. They both advanced to the state qualifier where Josh placed 5th in the 600 meters and Christian placed 3rd in the HJ. The girls were a scholar athlete team.

Girls/Boys Bowling: The Auburn Varsity Bowling teams both had a successful season this year. The girls won the SCAC league title, placed 3rd in the Section III Tournament, and lost the Class Tournament by 1 pin to finish in 2nd place. Kaylee Hodson, Lily Snyder, Amber Pidlypchak and Terrence O'Donnell earned the right to participate in the State Qualifier Tournament. Kaylee Hodson advanced to participate in the NYS Championship Bowling Tournament on Saturday, March 10th and had a 6 game total of 1083. Congratulations Kaylee!

FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.


