
The 2022 Graduation Ceremony will be held at Holland Stadium on June 24, 2022, at 6:30PM.


I WEAR MY MASK IN PUBLIC FOR THREE REASONS:


- HUMILITY: I don't know if I have COVID as it is clear that people can spread the disease before they have symptons.








The school district is pleased to continue our partnership with Anonymous Alerts®, the anti-bullying and safety reporting app and system. Starting in the 2018-2019 school year, this safety communications tool is a way for our students to quickly communicate anonymously with school officials and engage in anonymous 2-way communications to share more information about incidents. Types of concerns that may be reported include, but are not limited to, bullying, harassment, drug-related issues, fighting, weapons, threats, and more. The goal of this reporting system is to help maintain a safe school climate while giving students ample opportunity to securely communicate with school administrators without fear of retribution by their peers. The system will be monitored during school days between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.


