Hands-Only CPR has been shown to be effective for cardiac arrest. It can double or even triple a victim's chance of survival.


CPR Lessons in 8th Grade Health Class

Mrs. Newton's 8th grade Health classes learned the importance of "Hands Only CPR" in class in December. Students were taught the importance of activating the EMS (CALL 911) anytime they witness the sudden collapse of an adult, and then providing high-quality chest compressions by pushing hard and fast in the middle of the victim's chest for 100 beats per minute.

CPR can double or triple a person's chances of survival.

Remember that ANY CPR is better than NO CPR!

- Holly Festa, Art Teacher at Owasco Elementary engaged 48 of her 5th-grade students to submit artwork depicting Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. to The New York State Education Department (NYSED). NYSED is sponsoring its annual Student Art and Essay Exhibition where New York State schools were invited to submit student artwork and essays based on Dr. King's Six Principles of Nonviolence. Student work will be on view at the Empire State Plaza South Concourse. The February district newsletter will include more information, highlights from these submissions, and how to view the exhibition digitally.
- The DEI Task Force convened its fourth 2022 meeting on December 5 to specifically review work group sub-section drafts for each of five preliminary plans. The DEI Task Force will convene on January 5 to review the second draft of these plans.
- The *Demanding More* book club at Auburn Junior High concluded on December 6th.
- On December 5, Bill Berry and Dr. Renee Burgess presented a DEI update, answered a wide range of questions, and encouraged DEI ideas from participants at the District Parent Council meeting.
- Dr. Melissa Moore, Associate Dean for Title IX & Compliance at Le Moyne College spoke to Jeannette Oliver-Carr's Women's Studies class on December 7. Students were engaged by Dr. Moore's presentation and asked a variety of questions.
- Bill Berry has initiated a preliminary and small mentorship process at Owasco Elementary where he will assist students in navigating a diverse range of school and community topics of importance to students.
- On December 9, 2022, 31 AHS students from Ms. Julie Liccion's Cayuga 101 and Intermediate Child Psychology & Development classes participated in the 2022 Travel Unity Youth Summit Northeast convened in Auburn at the Cayuga Museum's Carriage House Theater. Hosted by Tour Cayuga, this local student event was organized by Dr. Burgess as part of the district's ongoing DEI initiatives to expose students to a diverse variety of career paths. This particular event focused on learning about travel as an activity and possible career path. College students from NYC and Atlanta, GA guided AHS students through a variety of travel related learning experiences and task-oriented activities with the assistance of Elijah Washington (Travel Unity,) Dawn Lubaszewski (Cayuga County Office of Tourism), as well as Auburn High School teachers who served as group leaders, Julie Liccion, Michael Losani, Melanie Maher, and DEI Consultant, Bill Berry. Students enjoyed a pizza lunch accompanied by salads, dressings, cookies, beverages, and assorted snacks. Superintendent Jeff Pirozzolo and Assistant Superintendent Amy Mahunik interacted with students and staff during the lunch break, as well as watched students present to the Travel Unity conference attendees at the Hilton Garden Inn. At the close of the Youth Summit, students were transported to the Hilton Garden Inn to present their group travel projects to the stand-alone Travel Unity Summit and had the opportunity to network with travel industry leaders. The Travel Unity Summit was convened at the Hilton Garden Inn from December 7 – 9.
- At the December 15th Instructional Coaches Academy, Bill Berry presented a few of his personal experiences dealing with race, class, bias, gender, and privilege in a participatory workshop.



Beginning February 1, 2023: Open Enrollment for Auburn Enlarged City School District's 2023-2024 Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program

The Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program is an integral component of our district and includes a UPK program for our 4-year-old learners and a 3PK program for 3-year olds. Together, these programs offer comprehensive educational services to Auburn Enlarged City School District (AECSD) residents who will be 3 or 4 years of age on or before December 1, 2023, and a limited number of slots are available at no cost for eligible children.

Parents/guardians can register their child online and upload the supporting documentation. The 3PK and UPK 2023-2024 online student registration will be open **beginning at 6:00AM on February 1, 2023, and continue until March 1, 2023.** *COMPLETE* applications will then be eligible for the PreK placement which will take place in late Spring, after the New York State allocations are determined for AECSD. In the event AECSD receives more applications than available state-sponsored PreK slots, the district is obligated to enact a random drawing to ensure equitable access for all students in determining who will participate.

During the application process, families will indicate their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choice of PreK sites. Students will be placed in their first choice unless that provider is full, in which case we will move to the other choices in their ranked order.

In the event a drawing becomes necessary, students not selected will be placed on a waitlist and added to a program as soon as slots become available. *Waitlist families, and those definite about which site they want for their child, are encouraged to check with providers regarding the availability of private pay/social services options at their selected sites.*

Applications received after March 1st will be added to the end of the waitlist, with placement made as slots become available.

A list of our Universal Pre-Kindergarten program locations (sites) below contains information regarding which sites offer 3PK and/or UPK and which sites provide full-day and/or half-day programs. Parents/guardians are welcome and encouraged to visit any of these participating sites before completing your child's registration. Kindly contact the site to arrange a visit.

Please register your student using the online enrollment form located at the link on the Auburn Enlarged City School District website www.AECSO.education under Student Registration, after February 1st.

Parents/guardians who prefer to submit their student's registration in person may pick up a 2023-2024 registration packet at any of the UPK sites listed above and also at any Auburn Elementary School or our Administrative Offices. Registration packets will be available for pick up in mid-January. Completed applications should be submitted to your child's current Pre-Kindergarten site or to the Harriet Tubman Administrative Offices at 78 Thornton Ave.

REMINDERS: We cannot accept any completed registration packets prior to February 1st and applications must be completed by March 1st in order to be considered for initial Fall placement. Transportation is the responsibility of families.

This program is for ages 8-12, but all ages are welcome.



The school district is pleased to continue our partnership with Anonymous Alerts®, the anti-bullying and safety reporting app and system. This safety communications tool is a way for our students to quickly communicate anonymously with school officials and engage in anonymous 2-way communications to share more information about incidents. Types of concerns that may be reported include, but are not limited to, bullying, harassment, drug-related issues, fighting, weapons, threats, and more. The goal of this reporting system is to help maintain a safe school climate while giving students ample opportunity to securely communicate with school administrators without fear of retribution by their peers. The system will be monitored during school days between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.




Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)

Students who are applying to colleges, please be aware that procedures for the confidentiality of student records within the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) have recently changed. FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.
