- Members of the AECSD administration participated in the May 15<sup>th</sup> Martin Luther King Jr. Day celebration convened at the Apostolic Church of God in Christ located on Fitch Avenue in Auburn. Due to COVID, this city-wide event was postponed in January and rescheduled for May.
- The Auburn Junior High School and High School bands marched in the June 18<sup>th</sup> Juneteenth parade down South Street to the Booker T. Washington Community Center located on Chapman Avenue where there was a full day of fun activities for children and adults with vendors, food trucks, bands, an on-site caterer serving dinner, and DJ.
- AECSD Superintendent, Jeff Pirozzolo marched with the school bands as well as district Business Manager, Lisa Green and Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction, Amy Mahunik. They were joined by Dr. Reneé Burgess, Executive Director of Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Instruction at BTW.

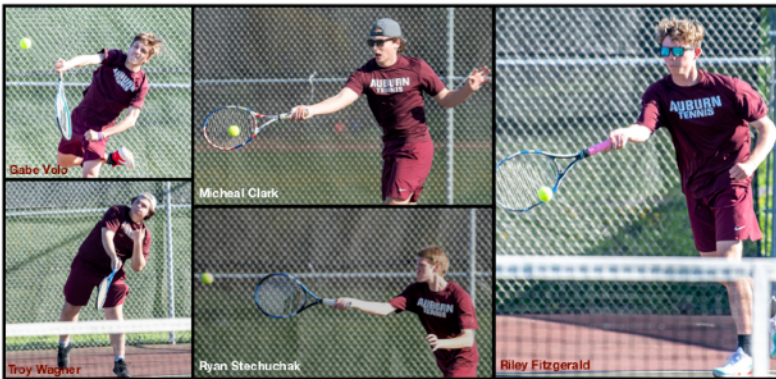

## **BMI Notification for 2022 – 2023 School Year**

As part of a required school health examination, a student is weighed and his/her height is measured. These numbers are used to figure out the student's body mass index, or "BMI." The BMI helps the doctor or nurse know if the student's weight is in a healthy range or is too high or too low. Recent changes to the New York State Education Law require that BMI and weight status group be included as part of the student's school health examination. A sample of school districts will be selected to be part of the survey; we will be reporting to New York State Department of Health information about our students' weight status groups. Only summary information is sent. No names and no information about individual students are sent. However, you may choose to have your child's information excluded from this survey report.

The information sent to the New York State Department of Health will help health officials develop programs that make it easier for children to be healthier.

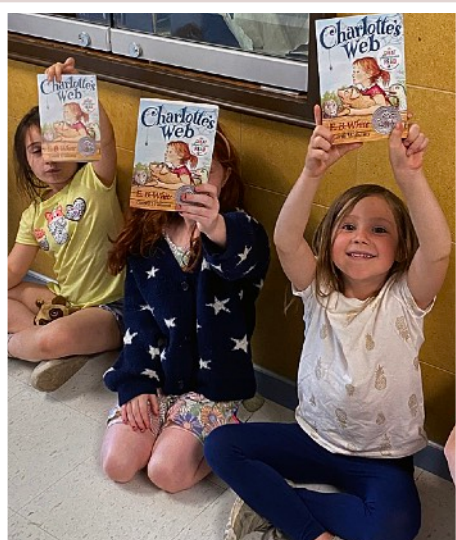

## Esports Clubs!

*New Extracurricular Activity*

In an effort to offer more students a opportunity to compete in extracurricular activities, the Auburn Enlarged City School District began an Esports program at Auburn High School and Auburn Junior High School. This February, students had a chance to play video games competitively against schools from around the country. Using a platform called PlayVs, students were able to create teams to play Rocket League on personal computers and SmashBros on the Nintendo Switch devices.



Rocket League is similar to soccer in terms of its gameplay, but cars are used instead of people to move the ball around. Each team is made up of 3 players and plays a best of 3 series against another team. At Auburn Junior High, there were 2 teams that competed and both had a record of 2-5 in the regular season.

Smash Bros consists of teams of 3 players that compete individually. Each player has a best of 3 series against another player. The team that wins 2 out of 3 series wins the match. Auburn High School had 2 teams compete. One team finished the regular season with a record of 1-6 while the other had a record of 5-2 making it into the playoffs. The playoffs consist of the top 64 teams in region playing an elimination style tournament like the NCAA basketball championship. After winning in the first round, the team lost in the second round to the team that went on to win the regional championship.

We are excited to share that the next season begins in September, and we are actively recruiting players. If your child(ren) is interested in competing in Esports, please encourage them to reach out to Mr. Drastal at Auburn Junior High or Mr. Sheppard and Mr. Bealer at Auburn High School. In the fall they can choose from Rocket League, Overwatch, League of Legends, NBA 2K, Madden, Splatoon, Smash Bros, or Mario Kart 8. We can have multiple teams play for each game, so there will be plenty of opportunity for your child(ren) to compete.

## PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

Dear Parents, Guardians, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Auburn Enlarged City School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

## Open Enrollment for Auburn Enlarged City School District's 2022-2023 Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program



The Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program is an integral component of our district and includes a UPK program for our 4-year-old learners and a 3PK program for 3-year olds. Together, these programs offer comprehensive educational services to **Auburn School District residents** who will be 3 or 4 years of age on or before December 1, 2022 and are available at **no cost** for eligible children.

A list of our Universal Pre-Kindergarten program locations (sites) below contains information regarding which sites offer 3PK and/or UPK and which sites provide full-day and/or half-day programs. FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.
