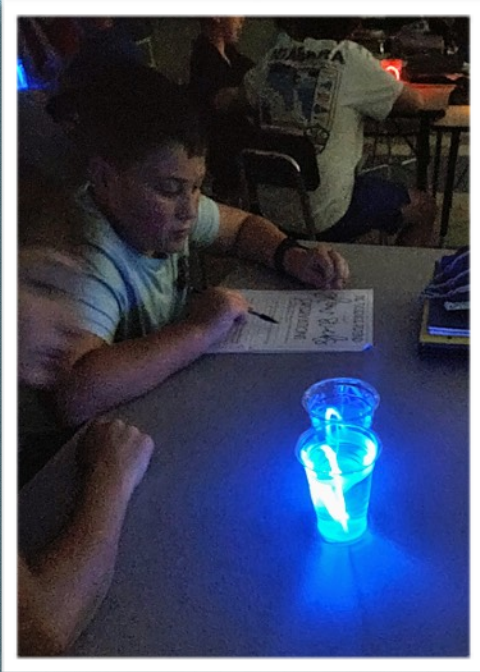


## Cool

# HABITAT to GO! at Herman



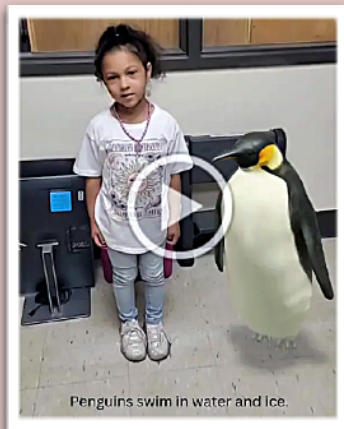
**First Grade Students at Herman Avenue School** had fun completing their last Project Based Learning (PBL) activity of the year! With the help of Mrs. Crosby, school librarian, students researched their favorite animal using the PebbleGo! digital research tool. They completed fact sheets about diet, habitat, range, and fun facts. Then, students planned their habitat models using Legos, which prepared them to build their animal clay models and habitats in their "Habitat To Go!" boxes!





## GENESEEE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL NEWS

The kindergarten students at Genesee Elementary recently completed an exciting research project on animals, working closely with Ms. Calarco in the library. They explored the research process, discovering the importance of sharing their new knowledge. To present the fascinating facts they learned about their chosen animals, the students created informational videos. These videos had a unique twist: they featured augmented reality (AR) animals. Through this project, the students gained an understanding of augmented reality and how it can be used as a tool for teaching and learning.

The fifth-grade students at Genesee Elementary have always shown great care for the environment and often venture outdoors to clean up their community. Recognizing their commitment to environmental stewardship, Ms. Calarco from the library discussed ways to make litter collection easier with the students. They decided that a grabber tool would be helpful. The students were then challenged to build, program, test, evaluate, and redesign the most efficient grabber tool they could using LEGO robotics.



The fourth graders at Genesee Elementary recently engaged in an exciting project using Makey Makey kits. This time, Ms. Calarco from the library teamed up with Ms. Taylor from music class. The students constructed model piano keys using found conductive materials and Makey Makeys. They then identified the musical notes that they created, enabling them to read sheet music and play a song.

Ms. Westover and Mr. Wrixon's second-grade class at Genesee has been working on an exciting robotics unit in the library, constructing various science models. One project focused on butterflies, where, thanks to an AEF grant, the students had the opportunity to raise butterflies and learn about them firsthand. They discovered that butterflies are important pollinators. Using LEGO robotics, the students were then challenged to build and program a model that demonstrates how butterflies pollinate flowers.

The third graders at Genesee Elementary have been busy in the library! Recently, they were learning about outer space. They discovered how engineers and computer scientists design robots, including rovers, to assist on space missions. The students were challenged to think like engineers, considering the various factors involved in designing rovers, with terrain being a primary concern. Using LEGO robotics, they built their own "rovers" and programmed them to travel through different terrains while avoiding obstacles.

The third graders were also exploring the concepts of force and motion in their classrooms. With Ms. Calarco in the library, they discovered how these principles apply to the game of mini golf. Working in small groups, the students designed their own mini golf holes. After finalizing their designs, they constructed their mini golf holes using provided materials. Their hard work paid off, as the entire Genesee student body and Pride got to play on their mini golf course during field days!

# PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

Dear Parents, Guardians, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Auburn Enlarged City School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

This safety communications tool is a way for our students to quickly communicate anonymously with school officials and engage in anonymous 2-way communications to share more information about incidents. Types of concerns that may be reported include, but are not limited to, bullying, harassment, drug-related issues, fighting, weapons, threats, and more. The goal of this reporting system is to help maintain a safe school climate while giving students ample opportunity to securely communicate with school administrators without fear of retribution by their peers. The system will be monitored during school days between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.
