Congratulations to Evan Bachta 2023 Scholastic Awards National Winner!



Evan Bachta, a 7th grader at the Auburn Junior High School has won a National Art Award for a piece he created called "Night Light". More than 100,000 students submitted more than 260,000 works of art and writing to the 2023 Scholastic Awards. Evan's work was selected by some of the foremost leaders in the visual and literary arts for excellence in originality, technical skill, and the emergence of a personal voice or vision. Less than 2,000 works received a National Medal, which places him within the top 1% of all submissions!

Evan originally took the photo standing in his front yard one evening over the summer. Using the photo as inspiration, Evan made

his drawing using white charcoal on black paper. He worked in his father's art studio at home. The piece won gold at the regional level and was on display at OCC for 6 weeks. It then moved on to compete nationally and he found out he won a national silver.

In June Evan's name will be listed in Scholastic's annual publication Best Teen Art and published in their Online Galleries at





The June 6 luncheon meeting's central purpose is to initiate community-wide partnership and collaboration on implementing and enhancing DEI throughout the larger community regardless of organizational scope.
- Dr. Burgess, Bill Berry, and district school Superintendent Jeffrey Pirozzolo will present the DEI Strategic Plan to the larger community on June 7 at the Cayuga Museum's Carriage House Theater at 5:30 PM. This event is free and open to the public.
- The school district, school officials, and students will support and participate in the city-wide activities celebrating 2023 Juneteenth second annual parade and Juneteenth family-based activities at the Booker T. Washington Community Center on June 17.

FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.
