The incorporation and utilization of these resources can help children organize their systems by offering both calming and alerting activities. These supports assist students in regulating behavior and in turn helps them focus in the classroom.

Together, these programs offer comprehensive educational services to **Auburn School District residents** who will be 3 or 4 years of age on or before December 1, 2024 and are available at **no cost** for eligible children.

FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.
