## Dear Auburn Families,

I hope everyone had a wonderful summer! We are excited to welcome everyone back for the 2023-2024 school year. We have some new faces this year and are looking forward to introducing our new staff to students and families again on the first day of school.

The summer months are a busy time as we plan and prepare for another school year. This summer, we hosted nearly 100 professional learning sessions for our staff that ranged from curriculum development and implementation support in all subject areas; learning best practices to ensure a sense of belonging in our classrooms; interventions in literacy and math; and the implementation of technology in instructional practices.

For the upcoming school year, we have hired dedicated STEM teachers to open up the doors of science, technology, engineering, art, and music. Technology instruction enhances the art and music curriculum through interdisciplinary design projects and experiments that connect to students' work in the classroom.

We are also excited to bring back fourth grade instrumental music to our five elementary schools. We will also continue to focus on support for students through multi-tiered systems where their academic behaviors and social-emotional needs are met.

Safety continues to be a priority in our district. We continue to add safety features in our buildings for our students, including campus notification systems that will continue to be implemented throughout the school year in each building. We appreciate the help from the Auburn Police Department for continuously working with us to put safety strategies in place. Additionally, we are pleased to welcome Auburn Police Capt. Androsko as the head of our SRO and SPO program this year.

Please join us at our District Parent Council meetings, which are typically held the first Monday of every month at 6:30 p.m. at the Harriet Tubman Administration Building, 78 Thornton Ave. We encourage anyone who would like to be a part of district discussions to attend. There is no need to sign up or contact anyone about joining. Just show up! Due to Labor Day, the first meeting is Monday, September 11 at 6:30 p.m.

## New Auburn teachers learn key lesson from schools tour

Starting a career as a teacher can be a daunting task, so to help prepare the new hires, the Auburn Enlarged City School District hosts a two-day orientation event at the Harriet Tubman Administration Building.

While the event on Aug. 21 and 22 featured presentations on what they need to know to be able to do their jobs, the new teachers also learned an important lesson outside of the classroom – what makes the Auburn district special.



The new teachers stepped onto a school bus and toured all seven of the district's school buildings; the five elementary schools, Auburn Junior High School and Auburn High School.

The tour included giveaways, including items from the Cayuga Museum of History and Art and the Equal Rights Heritage Center.

At each building, the teachers were warmly greeted by the school's principal and other administrators. Each principal spoke about their facility, its history, the make-up of the student body, what programs it specializes in and how it helps its students with Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS).

Herman Avenue Elementary Principal Kelly Garback and Assistant Principal Brianne Batis prepared "New Teacher Survival Kit" bags that included items such as a rubber band, to remind the new teachers to be "flexible," a pointer, "to point you in the right direction when you're feeling lost" and chocolate "to reflect upon all the sweet moments."

The bags were a fun way to tell the new teachers that there will be challenges in their careers but they're not alone.

That was the point that was driven home by all seven principals, a common belief of what makes the Auburn district unique – a feeling of togetherness and family spirit – from the administration to its teachers and other employees.

"That's where my mom taught her whole life. So that is how I got the opportunity to sub in Auburn because she taught here," said Derek Dietshe, who will be a STEM teacher at Casey Park Elementary. "I'm excited to teach (here). The way we treat the students, and the way students treat us is just a lot better environment here. So I love Auburn."

The lessons that the new teachers and administrators will learn in their careers here will continue the Auburn Enlarged City School District's tradition of togetherness and family spirit.

## DIVERSITY, EQUITY & INCLUSION

- Over the summer, the district finalized its Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Strategic Plan. It was rolled out to members of cabinet, directors, and building-level leadership on July 19. We would like to thank our 2022-2023 DEI task force members for all their hard work.
- The district's second annual summer book club completed its readings and discussions in August. Sixteen teachers, teaching assistants, and administrators participated in reading Mary-Frances Winters' *We Can't Talk About That at Work!*
- Dr. Renee Burgess, Executive Director of DEI and Instruction and Michelle Kolceski, Director of Early Learning and ENL presented the Culturally Responsive-Sustaining Framework during the Supporting ELL Students summer professional learning session on July 28.
- New staff participated in a bus tour during new teacher orientation on August 21. New hires traveled to each of the district's seven buildings to see and learn about each school and its community.
- The district has a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion tab on its website. Our DEI Strategic Plan, recruitment flier, and resources will be housed here.
- On August 3, district personnel, including all cabinet members and members of the administrative team, participated in the United Way's "Day of Caring," an annual program to assist the work of local non-profits in a variety of work tasks. Our team members volunteered at the Salvation Army and Camp Caspar Gregory in Aurora and performed various tasks.

## Elementary Summer School program successful

Seward Elementary School Principal and Summer School Principal Melissa O'Donnell was thrilled with how the Auburn Enlarged City School District's 2023 elementary summer school program turned out.

"It was a fantastic and successful program," she said. "We had representation from all of the elementary schools with a pretty equal number of teachers from each of our elementary schools."

The district started its elementary summer school program two years ago as a way to provide extra assistance to students who may have gaps in their learning because of COVID-19.

This year's program featured one fifth grade classroom, two fourth grade classrooms, three third grade classrooms, four second grade classrooms, four first grade classrooms and three kindergarten classrooms.

The program aims not just to help the students catch up on skills they need to work on but also get them prepared for the start of the next school year in September.

"We focused on learning deficits and really making sure that the students who are coming to summer school really are students who truly need summer school," O'Donnell said, "and can get an extra boost of learning for the summer, so that they don't slide down the summer slide farther when they come back in the fall."



Teachers from all over the district came together to help out.

"I just thought that all of the teachers worked really well together to create this kind of environment," O'Donnell said, "that even though we're all from different buildings, we're all together."

That spirit of togetherness really stood out to O'Donnell.

"I've been in education now for 12 years, and I've worked summer school every single year, and the teachers in Auburn are just so amazing," she said. "They want what's best for our kids all of the time."

O'Donnell said parents were pleased with the summer school program, some wishing it was longer because their children had so much fun while learning.

O'Donnell wanted to give special praise to a trio for the summer school program's success.

Meghan Mannerich was the summer school intern and worked with the CNY Food Bank Child Nutrition Manager Rufus Kearse to provide breakfast and lunch for the students.

"Meghan was just an asset to the program, and I don't know what I would have done without her," O'Donnell said.

Jenna Stevens, the summer school secretary, was singled out for getting everything in order.

## THE DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICY

The **Auburn Enlarged City School District** is committed to providing students with a school environment that promotes student health and wellness and reduces childhood obesity. The District Wellness Policy can be viewed on the district website. As part of the policy, the district shall:

- **ensure** that all foods and beverages available in school promote good nutrition, balance and reasonable portion sizes;
- **promote** the sale of non-food items or activities for school fundraisers;
- **recommend** non-food classroom celebrations;
- **promote** the integration of physical activity in the classroom and encourage staff, families and community to participate in and model physical activity as a valuable part of daily life;
- **integrate** nutrition education that teaches the knowledge, skills and values needed to adopt healthy eating behaviors into the curriculum;
- **promote** fruits, vegetables, whole grain products, low fat dairy products, safe and healthy food preparation methods and health-enhancing nutrition practices;
- **inform** and update the public about the content, implementation and effectiveness of this policy.

## • BACK-TO-SCHOOL CHECKLIST •

### For Parents Who Have Students with a Health Concern:

- ➔ Make your child's health concern known to the school and school nurse.
- ➔ Introduce yourself and your child to the school nurse.
- ➔ Bring current signed healthcare provider orders.
- ➔ Together with the school nurse and other appropriate school officials, and family, develop an individualized healthcare plan (or other educational plans, as needed, e.g., 504, IEP).
- ➔ Give permission for the school nurse to communicate with your family's healthcare provider.
- ➔ Provide parent/guardian contact information and update the school with any changes.
- ➔ Ask if non-nurses will be providing care (for example, verify who will administer medication) and how these authorized individuals will be supervised.
- ➔ Confirm the school's disaster/emergency plan. Make sure your child's medication and/or medical devices (epinephrine auto-injectors, asthma inhalers, insulin, etc.) will be readily available in an emergency.

### For All Parents and Students:

- ➔ Make sure immunizations are up-to-date.
- ➔ Review hygiene tips to prevent the spread of infections.
- ➔ Establish a bedtime and wake-up time to ensure adequate and consistent sleep.
- ➔ Develop a routine for homework and after school activities.
- ➔ Eat breakfast each day at home or at school.
- ➔ Help make appropriate clothing choices (for example, wear comfortable and safe shoes).
- ➔ Keep an open line of communication with your child to ensure that he/she remains safe at school. If a concern arises (such as bullying), contact the appropriate school officials immediately.
- ➔ Get involved! Sign up for the parent organization (PTA/PTO), District Wellness Committee, District Parent Council, and mark events such as back-to-school night and parent/teacher meetings on your calendar.
- ➔ Ask about the school or district's wellness policy (for example, how does the school address nutrition, activity, stress and mental health concerns).

## STUDENT HEALTH EXAMINATIONS UPDATE

All students in Kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11, as well as students wishing to participate in sports or become eligible for a working permit, and all new students to the district are mandated by New York State Education Law to have a current examination on record in the health office. The Health Staff encourages you to use your private health care provider for all required school health appraisals for better continuity of care. Should you choose to have a health appraisal done by the school physician or nurse practitioner in school, it will be scheduled at the convenience of the district.

Your child will be asked to disrobe to underclothing. While every effort is made to preserve dignity and privacy, most health offices are too small to provide the level of privacy your child may be used to in his or her private provider's office.

The physician conducts a mini-interview for history. These are age appropriate questions identified by the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Pediatrics. Next, the physical screening examination is done. The exam includes a head-to-toe screening of all major organ systems. Please do not ask the school to conduct this exam unless you seek your own child's permission and understanding of the nature of the exam. Because school examinations, by law, are only screening exams and school providers may not diagnose or prescribe in a school setting, you will be advised of any areas of concern found on examination that require further evaluation by your own provider.

One last suggestion regarding private examinations. Most physicians recommend that you time annual exams around your child's birthday. It may take six to twelve weeks to schedule an appointment, especially over the summer. Please plan accordingly if you have these exams done privately. We understand that during this transition we will all need to be flexible, especially regarding sports participation. Our goal is to facilitate your child's ability to play in a chosen sport. All we ask is that if you have already had an exam done, that you please take a moment to call your private physician to get proof of the exam into the school nurse as soon as possible.

## PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

Dear Parents, Guardians, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Auburn Enlarged City School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

## FEDERAL ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT (AHERA) NOTIFICATION

The Auburn Enlarged City School District, in accordance with Section 763.93 of the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), submitted Asbestos Management Plans to the New York State Education Department in 1989. Updated and reviewed annually, these plans contain reports of the accredited asbestos inspector and the reports of the accredited laboratory which analyzed the inspection samples that were taken.

The Management Plans also describe:

- Places in each school building where asbestos was identified
- Response actions taken to date including abatement of asbestos in elementary, junior high and high school boiler rooms, corridors, classrooms, crawl spaces, and storage areas.

Copies of the Management Plans are available in each of the Principal's office and in the District office. The plans may be reviewed during regular business hours daily, Monday - Friday. Any questions or requests for additional information pertaining to the asbestos plan should be directed to:


### Enhanced STAR Exemption for Senior Citizens

Senior property owners who already have a Basic STAR Exemption on their primary residence may be eligible for the Enhanced STAR Exemption when they are 65. You should apply when you are 64 so that, if you qualify, you may receive the exemption beginning the year that you turn 65. Auburn city residents should contact the Assessor's Office at City Hall on South Street (255-4125). Other Auburn (Aurelius, Throop, Owasco, Sennett, Fleming) and Cayuga County residents should contact their local assessor's office. The deadline for applications for Auburn city residents is February 1. Other Auburn and Cayuga County residents should check with their local assessor.

The Enhanced STAR program for senior citizens provides eligible seniors an exemption from school property taxes for owner-occupied, primary residences. To be eligible for this exemption, a property owner must be 65 years of age or older on December 31, 2023, with income not exceeding \$93,200.

Enhanced STAR provides qualifying households with up to a \$81,400 exemption on the full value of their property. Qualifying residents owning a home with a full value of \$100,000 would recognize an estimated tax savings of \$1,181 from the Enhanced STAR for the tax year in which they qualify.
