Auburn student builds, donates little libraries

Auburn High School student Mitchell Homick knew early on what he was going to do for his Eagle Scout service project.

Homick, a Boy Scout in Troop 21, which is led by Scoutmaster John Hai, has spent the last year building little libraries that he donated to the Auburn Enlarged City School District's elementary schools. He also did two for the town of Throop, one at Sawyer Park and the other at the Throop Sports Complex.

"I always thought about this for my Eagle project," said Homick, who is going to be a senior in September, "but Mrs. Ridley, who works at Owasco, was saying how for Throop, they were thinking about little libraries and I was thinking about the idea so that worked out and then it extended to the school district from that."

Little libraries are spots where children can take a book and leave one in a way to foster a fondness for reading.

"It just has been quite the process watching him as a little Cub (Scout) all the way to Eagle and that he's giving back to the elementary schools and his education has been so important to him," said Mitchell's mother Taryn, who is a teacher assistant at Owasco. "That's a huge thing. The way it worked out was he came to me and he said, 'I think I want to do little libraries as my project' and I said, 'oh goodness, that's a huge undertaking.' The next day, I just happened to be at work and Mrs. Ridley said, 'Do you know anybody who needs to do an Eagle (Scout) project or a Girl Scout project and wants to do little libraries?' It just kind of came full circle because Miss Ridley was his second-grade teacher and the way she read to her students."

For one of the little libraries, Homick refurbished an old newspaper coin box that was donated to Owasco Elementary School. He wasn't able to find any more boxes so he built shelving units for the other schools.

"There's only one box that we could refurbish, the other boxes were not there," he said. "So we had to do the shelves for it, but the boxes are meant to take a book, leave a book."

"When the project initially started, we were under the impression that all the schools had the boxes," Taryn Homick said, "and then as we contacted all the schools, they said, we got rid of them. He improvised and came up with something that the schools could still take if they wanted it and we were able to take this one and refurbish it. The scouts are thrifty. It's one of their pledges to be thrifty."

Mitchell said the books have been donated by teachers and other community members and he's optimistic that it will spur students to read more.

Admittance Policies:

- Elementary students attending games must be accompanied by a parent and be under the parent's supervision during the contest.

Cayuga County Residents Are Urged To “Fight The Bite” As Mosquito-Borne Illnesses Are On The Rise

The Health Department is reminding the public to continue to be vigilant and use personal protection measures to minimize being bitten by mosquitoes.

Take the following precautions to prevent mosquito bites and mosquito-borne disease:

- Mosquitoes are most active from dusk to dawn.
- Avoid spending time outdoors when mosquitoes are most active (dusk to dawn). If you are going to be outside during active mosquito times:
 - Use an EPA certified mosquito repellent containing 20-30% DEET or picaridin. Follow the label directions. Repellent should not be used on babies younger than 2 months old.
 - Cover your skin as completely as possible when outside when mosquitoes are present and active. Wear closed toe shoes, socks, long pants, and long-sleeved
 - Make sure screens in your windows and doors are tight-fitting, free of tears, rips, and holes.

Many types of mosquitoes lay their eggs in standing water. Reduce mosquito breeding around your home by eliminating standing water on your property.

- Clean clogged rain gutters.
- Turn over wheelbarrows and wading pools when not in use.
- Change water in bird baths every four days.
- Properly maintain swimming pools, outdoor saunas, and hot tubs; drain water from pool covers.
- Use landscaping to eliminate low spots where standing water accumulates.
- Remove unused tires from your property.
- Drill holes in the bottoms of recycling containers that are kept outdoors.

If you cannot eliminate standing water around your you may want to consider treating the water with mosquito dunks. Mosquito dunks contain bacteria that kill mosquito larvae. They do not kill adult mosquitoes. Mosquito dunks can be purchased at your local hardware store.

If you own a horse:

- Consult your veterinarian to discuss preventative methods.
- EEEV vaccination is effective at preventing clinical disease in horses. Consult your vet about your horse’s vaccination status.

THE DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICY

The **Auburn Enlarged City School District** is committed to providing students with a school environment that promotes student health and wellness and reduces childhood obesity. The District Wellness Policy can be viewed on the district website. As part of the policy, the district shall:

- **ensure** that all foods and beverages available in school promote good nutrition, balance and reasonable portion sizes;
- **promote** the sale of non-food items or activities for school fundraisers;
- **recommend** non-food classroom celebrations;
- **promote** the integration of physical activity in the classroom and encourage staff, families and community to participate in and model physical activity as a valuable part of daily life;
- **integrate** nutrition education that teaches the knowledge, skills and values needed to adopt healthy eating behaviors into the curriculum;
- **promote** fruits, vegetables, whole grain products, low fat dairy products, safe and healthy food preparation methods and health-enhancing nutrition practices;
- **inform** and update the public about the content, implementation and effectiveness of this policy.

• BACK-TO-SCHOOL CHECKLIST •

For Parents Who Have Students with a Health Concern:

- ➔ Make your child's health concern known to the school and school nurse.
- ➔ Introduce yourself and your child to the school nurse.
- ➔ Bring current signed healthcare provider orders.
- ➔ Together with the school nurse and other appropriate school officials, and family, develop an individualized healthcare plan (or other educational plans, as needed, e.g., 504, IEP).
- ➔ Give permission for the school nurse to communicate with your family's healthcare provider.
- ➔ Provide parent/guardian contact information and update the school with any changes.
- ➔ Ask if non-nurses will be providing care (for example, verify who will administer medication) and how these authorized individuals will be supervised.
- ➔ Confirm the school's disaster/emergency plan. Make sure your child's medication and/or medical devices (epinephrine auto-injectors, asthma inhalers, insulin, etc.) will be readily available in an emergency.

For All Parents and Students:

- ➔ Make sure immunizations are up-to-date.
- ➔ Review hygiene tips to prevent the spread of infections.
- ➔ Establish a bedtime and wake-up time to ensure adequate and consistent sleep.
- ➔ Develop a routine for homework and after school activities.
- ➔ Eat breakfast each day at home or at school.
- ➔ Help make appropriate clothing choices (for example, wear comfortable and safe shoes).
- ➔ Keep an open line of communication with your child to ensure that he/she remains safe at school. If a concern arises (such as bullying), contact the appropriate school officials immediately.
- ➔ Get involved! Sign up for the parent organization (PTA/PTO), District Wellness Committee, District Parent Council, and mark events such as back-to-school night and parent/teacher meetings on your calendar.
- ➔ Ask about the school or district's wellness policy (for example, how does the school address nutrition, activity, stress and mental health concerns).

STUDENT HEALTH EXAMINATIONS UPDATE

All students in Kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11, as well as students wishing to participate in sports or become eligible for a working permit, and all new students to the district are mandated by New York State Education Law to have a current examination on record in the health office. The Health Staff encourages you to use your private health care provider for all required school health appraisals for better continuity of care. Should you choose to have a health appraisal done by the school physician or nurse practitioner in school, it will be scheduled at the convenience of the district.

Your child will be asked to disrobe to underclothing. While every effort is made to preserve dignity and privacy, most health offices are too small to provide the level of privacy your child may be used to in his or her private provider's office.

The physician conducts a mini-interview for history. These are age appropriate questions identified by the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Pediatrics. Next, the physical screening examination is done. The exam includes a head-to-toe screening of all major organ systems. Please do not ask the school to conduct this exam unless you seek your own child's permission and understanding of the nature of the exam. Because school examinations, by law, are only screening exams and school providers may not diagnose or prescribe in a school setting, you will be advised of any areas of concern found on examination that require further evaluation by your own provider.

One last suggestion regarding private examinations. Most physicians recommend that you time annual exams around your child's birthday. It may take six to twelve weeks to schedule an appointment, especially over the summer. Please plan accordingly if you have these exams done privately. We understand that during this transition we will all need to be flexible, especially regarding sports participation. Our goal is to facilitate your child's ability to play in a chosen sport. All we ask is that if you have already had an exam done, that you please take a moment to call your private physician to get proof of the exam into the school nurse as soon as possible.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE TO ALL STUDENTS

Public Health Law §2164 applies to children attending all schools as defined in Public Health Law §2164 which include any public, private or parochial child-caring center, day nursery, day care agency, nursery school, kindergarten, elementary, intermediate, or secondary school. Public Health Law §2164 prohibits a school from permitting any child to be admitted to such school, or to attend such school in excess of 14 days without sufficient evidence that the child has received all age-appropriate required vaccinations.

PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

Dear Parents, Guardians, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Auburn Enlarged City School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

FEDERAL ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT (AHERA) NOTIFICATION

The Auburn Enlarged City School District, in accordance with Section 763.93 of the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), submitted Asbestos Management Plans to the New York State Education Department in 1989. Updated and reviewed annually, these plans contain reports of the accredited asbestos inspector and the reports of the accredited laboratory which analyzed the inspection samples that were taken.

The Management Plans also describe:

- Places in each school building where asbestos was identified
- Response actions taken to date including abatement of asbestos in elementary, junior high and high school boiler rooms, corridors, classrooms, crawl spaces, and storage areas.

Copies of the Management Plans are available in each of the Principal's office and in the District office. The plans may be reviewed during regular business hours daily, Monday - Friday. Any questions or requests for additional information pertaining to the asbestos plan should be directed to:

FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.

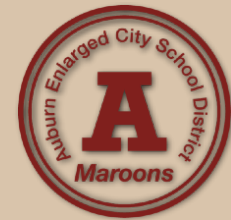
Enhanced STAR Exemption for Senior Citizens

Senior property owners who already have a Basic STAR Exemption on their primary residence may be eligible for the Enhanced STAR Exemption when they are 65. You should apply when you are 64 so that, if you qualify, you may receive the exemption beginning the year that you turn 65. Auburn city residents should contact the Assessor's Office at City Hall on South Street (255-4125). Other Auburn (Aurelius, Throop, Owasco, Sennett, Fleming) and Cayuga County residents should contact their local assessor's office. The deadline for applications for Auburn city residents is February 1. Other Auburn and Cayuga County residents should check with their local assessor.

The Enhanced STAR program for senior citizens provides eligible seniors an exemption from school property taxes for owner-occupied, primary residences. To be eligible for this exemption, a property owner must be 65 years of age or older on December 31, 2024, with income not exceeding \$98,700.

Enhanced STAR provides qualifying households with up to a \$84,000 exemption on the full value of their property. Qualifying residents owning a home with a full value of \$100,000 would recognize an estimated tax savings of \$1,181 from the Enhanced STAR for the tax year in which they qualify.
