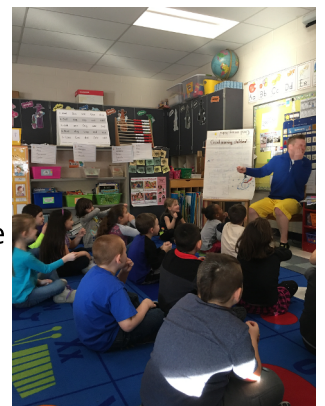
This year in Mrs. Williams' 4th grade class, Mrs. Petrosino and Mrs. Williams have implemented the CAFE Menu system (Gail Boushey & Joan Moser, "The Sisters"). CAFE is an acronym for Comprehension, Accuracy, Fluency and Expanding vocabulary. Using a whole-class board, strategies are introduced, posted on the menu and practiced during read-to-self time. This serves as a visual reminder of whole-class instruction as well as individual student goals. A letter for each strategy is sent home to parents that provides suggestions for assisting their child with the strategy at home. Mrs. Petrosino and Mrs. Williams conference with students individually, tracking each child's strengths and goals and collecting data to inform future instruction. Each student has goals and strategies specific to his/her individual needs. Students also have opportunities to write about what they are reading in their journals. Students enjoy the time they have to read from their good-fit books, and are proud they have achieved 35 minutes of reading stamina so far this year. When asked how to become a better reader, students respond...by reading!

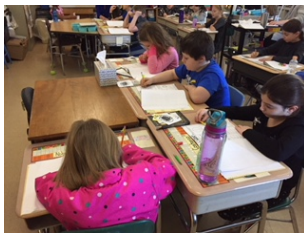


MATH FUN

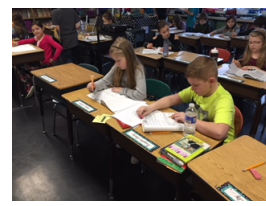
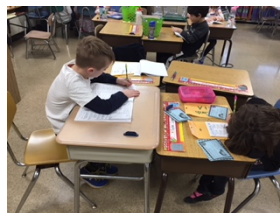
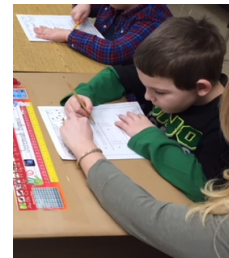

Here are a few of the students ideas:

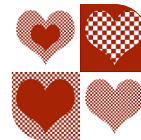
I have a dream that people make better choices. by Kevin
