Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day is an opportunity for children to share acts of kindness or words of encouragement with one another as well as home. Children are allowed to bring Valentine cards to school by Monday February 8 or Tuesday February 9 at the latest. Out of an abundance of caution, the cards will sit "in quarantine" until the recipients can take them home on Wednesday or Thursday. Students will have store bought, individually wrapped treats at school as well. Homeroom teachers will distribute the necessary information.

Good Goals and Interesting Challenges for 2021!

One of our School Comprehensive Education Plan (SCEP) goals is "to increase student participation in the 2020-2021 Math and ELA state assessments; an increase in the rate of participation by 20%-25% is expected." This goal presents both a challenge and an opportunity for Owasco.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015 requires that every state assess all students in English language arts and math each year in grades 3-8 each year. States must ensure that 95% of students in each public school participate yearly in required state assessments. The ESSA law allows educators to equitably use resources to close opportunity gaps and improve learning outcomes for all our students - that's a good opportunity for students.

Math and ELA state assessments are designed to measure how well students are mastering the learning standards and progressing in the skills and concepts taught in the classroom. We use the data to adjust their instruction and stay on track to meet benchmarks. Widespread participation yields data that allows us to identify gaps and provide support and resources to the students who need them - another good opportunity to support student learning.

The challenge for Owasco's SCEP goal is that New York State did not administer the tests last year due to the pandemic and we are not sure whether it will take place this year either, so increasing participation may not be an option related to this goal. At the moment we are planning on giving the assessment in April, however if the NYS Department of Education makes changes to the assessment plan, we will share that updated information with you.

Another good thing related to this goal is that Owasco will foster school wide achievement by combining our PBIS initiatives with a "Show what you know" theme. We have started virtual morning announcements where all classes "tune in" to share important information from the day along with student accomplishments. We will also begin to add class news to our newsletter with a "show what you know" theme. Teachers participate in data discussions weekly to track student progress. We will do these activities regardless of NYS assessment plans. These are all good things!
