Join REMIND!

This year, due to the Remind app's new terms and conditions, there will be a Remind class for each grade level. Whole-building announcements will be sent to all grade levels.

The Remind app is used to send messages to families via text. Receivers can reply to the sender, but no other users can view the replies. This allows you to receive reminders for special events, meetings, and any school delays or closings.

Anonymous Alerts

Anonymous Alerts is an online system that allows students to quickly, easily, and anonymously report strange behavior and information to school officials.

Possible incidents to report could include bullying, cyberbullying, family difficulties, self-harm, drug and alcohol abuse, student depression, sexual harassment, fighting, weapons, threats, and abnormal student behavior.

The best way to address problems faced in school is by telling a teacher, principal, psychologist, or counselor. However, we do understand that sometimes a student may want to communicate something anonymously. The most important thing to remember is: <u>See something</u>, <u>Do something</u>!

All reports submitted through Anonymous Alerts remain completely anonymous, but students do have the option to reveal their identity. The program is monitored from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. on school days, but it is very important to understand that school officials will not be on the system every minute. Anonymous Alerts should only be used for serious matters, but **if something seems disturbing or life threatening, call 911 immediately.**



Did you know that **absenteeism** in the first month of school can predict poor attendance through the school year? Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
