CURRICULUM CORNER



Students are finishing up the Happily Ever After Reading Program.

This program sets the stage for the **Superkids Reading Program** in Kindergarten, so the students are ready to jump right in!

Letters: Students have learned all 26 capital and lowercase letters.

Colors: Students have learned the following colors this year: red, yellow, blue, orange, green, purple, black, white, pink, gray, & brown.

HomeLink: Research shows that 5-year-old children need **Rhyming Activities**, which are an early predictor of reading skills. Listen to rhymes in music. Have your child give a thumbs up or thumbs down if two words that you say rhyme!

Math: Students have been composing (making numbers) and decomposing (breaking numbers into its parts) for numbers 0-10.

Numbers: We have been focusing on numbers 0-10. Also, students have been practicing addition and subtraction for numbers 0-5. They have also been measuring by weight and length.

Positional Words: Students are describing objects

Shapes: Students continue to work with flat shapes (circle, square, triangle, and rectangle) and 3-dimensional shapes (cylinder, cube, cone, and pyramid).

HomeLink: Practice counting common objects at home, such as socks, spoons, and grapes. Take away some and recount, talking about what you've done to make the new number.
